8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the Alabama Construction
9 Recruitment Institute provides for the recruitment
10 of, and training programs and opportunities for,
11 new construction craft trade workers in the state.

12 Also under existing law, construction craft
13 industry fees, which are levied and imposed on
14 wages paid by employers on employees engaged in
15 skilled labor in the performance of a construction
16 contract or job in the state, and remitted to the
17 Department of Revenue for the purpose of funding a
18 program providing for the recruitment of, and
19 training opportunities for, new construction craft
20 trade labor in the state, are scheduled to expire
21 on May 18, 2013.

22 This bill would subject the Alabama
23 Construction Recruitment Institute, as an
24 enumerated agency, to the Alabama Sunset Law.

25 This bill would also provide for the
26 continued collection of construction craft industry
27 fees.

A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

Relating to the Alabama Construction Recruitment Institute; to subject the institute to the Alabama Sunset Law; to amend Section 7 of Act 2009-561, 2009 Regular Session (Acts 2009, p. 1629), as confirmed in Section 7 of Act 2010-220, 2010 Regular Session (Acts 2010, p. 365), and to repeal Section 7 of Act 2010-220, 2010 Regular Session (Acts 2010, p. 365), to provide for the continued collection of construction craft industry fees.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The Alabama Construction Recruitment Institute shall be subject to the Alabama Sunset Law, Chapter 20, Title 41, Code of Alabama 1975, as an enumerated agency as provided in Section 41-20-3, Code of Alabama 1975, and shall have a termination date of October 1, 2014, and every four years thereafter, unless continued pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law.

Section 2. Section 7 of Act 2009-561, 2009 Regular Session (Acts 2009, p. 1629), as confirmed in Section 7 of Act 2010-220, 2010 Regular Session (Acts 2010, p. 365), providing for the expiration of the collection of construction craft industry fees, is amended to read as follows:

"Section 7. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law, and the passage and approval by the Governor of SB301 of the 2009 Regular Session of the Alabama Legislature, or SB301 otherwise becoming law and shall expire and be repealed four years after its effective date."

Section 3. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed. Specifically, Section 7 of Act 2010-220, 2010 Regular Session (Acts 2010, p. 365), confirming the expiration of the collection of construction craft industry fees on May 18, 2013, as provided in Section 7 of Act 2009-561, 2009 Regular Session (Acts 2009, p. 1629), is repealed.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
