8 SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, military spouses relocating to the State of Alabama with an active duty member of the United States Armed Forces may be unreasonably delayed in utilizing a professional license or certificate, previously earned in another state, to continue earning income in the State of Alabama.

This bill would provide for the expedited issuance of professional licenses and certificates for the spouses of active duty military personnel relocating to the State of Alabama under official military orders. This bill would further provide for the recognition of professional licenses and certificates obtained by military spouses in other states with greater than or substantially similar licensing criteria as the State of Alabama or for the creation of reciprocity for professional licensing and certification between Alabama and other states.

11	Section 1. Except as provided in Section 6 of this
12	act, and notwithstanding other provisions of law, this act
13	shall apply to any board, agency, commission, or other entity
14	providing professional licenses or certificates, or both, for
15	the purpose of employment in the State of Alabama. Each board,
16	commission, or agency providing professional licenses or
17	certificates, or both, may promulgate rules in conformity with
18	this act for the purpose of implementing its requirements.
19	Section 2. Except as provided in Section 6 of this
20	act, and notwithstanding other provisions of law, this act
21	shall apply to individuals who:
22	(1) Are married to and living with an active duty

1 (3) Have not been disciplined by an authorized 2 entity or are under investigation in any jurisdiction, in 3 relation to a professional license or certificate.

(4) Pay any required fee and submit to any required criminal or other background check by an authorized board, commission, or agency in the State of Alabama.

Section 3. (1) An authorized board, commission, or agency shall expedite the issuance of a professional license or certificate applied for by an eligible individual under Section 2 of this act.

(2) A temporary professional license or certificate shall be issued for eligible individuals under Section 2 of this act who possess a valid license or certificate from another state with greater or substantially similar licensing requirements than required by the State of Alabama. Such temporary license or certificate shall not be valid for more than six months after the date of issuance.

Section 4. (1) Any eligible individual under Section 2 of this act who possesses a valid license or certificate in another state, district, or territory of the United States with licensing or certification requirements greater than or substantially similar to the licensing or certification requirements of the appropriate board, commission, or agency in the State of Alabama shall be approved to continue work in his or her profession upon relocation to the State of Alabama for up to six months with receipt of a temporary license or certificate or for such time as normally allotted with receipt

of a full license or certificate from the appropriate board, commission, or agency. Such authorization shall be expedited.

(2) Any board, commission, or agency in the State of Alabama may establish reciprocity with other states for military spouse professional licensing and certification.

Section 5. An eligible individual under Section 2 of this act who is overseas with his or her spouse who is an active duty member of the United States Armed Forces shall be exempt from any fees or other requirements to maintain his or her professional license or certificate in the State of Alabama while outside of the United States on official military orders. This exemption is valid for six months upon return to United States territory.

Section 6. This act does not apply to the practice of law or the regulation of attorneys.

Section 7. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
