25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. The following amendment to the
27	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become

valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of this act are fulfilled:

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## PROPOSED AMENDMENT

(a) In addition to any court costs or fees now or hereafter authorized, and notwithstanding any other provisions of the Constitution including, without limitation, Sections 96, 104, and 105, there shall be in Covington County, in each civil or quasi-civil action at law, suit in equity, criminal, or quasi-criminal case or any other proceeding filed in, arising in, or brought by appeal, certiorari, or otherwise in the circuit court, inferior court, or other court in the county, including municipal courts, there shall be taxed as part of the costs the sum of twelve dollars (\$12). The fees taxed under this section shall be collected as other costs in such cases are collected; and when collected by the clerk or other collecting officers of such courts, including the register of the circuit court, shall be paid to the treasurer or depository as herein set forth. The sums so paid over to the county treasury or depository shall be maintained in a separate account in the county treasury or depository designated as the county law library fund. The funds shall be expended by the judges of the circuit court of the county for establishing, maintaining, equipping, and operating a law library within the county and for the administration of the courts in the circuit. The judges shall authorize the county treasurer to draw warrants on the county treasury or depository in making expenditures for the purposes

contemplated in this section and shall indicate on the warrants the fund against which the warrants are drawn. The items of costs referred to above shall be designated as law library fees; and when any part of the costs in a case has been paid, the amount necessary for the payment of the fee shall be applied thereto before applying any of the amount paid as costs to any other item of costs. On or before the tenth day of each month, the clerks or other collecting officers of the courts, including the register of the circuit court, shall pay over to the county treasurer or depository all amounts collected as law library fees prior to the first day of the month. The management of the law library is rested in the judges of the circuit court in the county. All books or other property purchased with the funds produced by this section shall be the property of the county. The court costs levied pursuant to this amendment shall be in lieu of the court costs levied pursuant to Act 1983-68 and said act shall be inoperable following the effective date of this amendment.

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(b) Any local law enacted prior to the effective date of this amendment which in whole or in part regulate costs and charges of courts in Covington County are hereby in all things ratified, approved, validated and confirmed as of the date of their enactment any provisions of the Constitution of Alabama 1901 to the contrary notwithstanding. Any actions taken or payments made in accordance with the provisions of said laws are hereby ratified, approved, validated and confirmed.

1 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 2 shall be held in accordance with Amendment 555 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 3 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 5 6 state. 7 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 8 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 9 10 following description of the substance or subject matter of 11 the proposed constitutional amendment: 12 "Relating to Covington County, proposing an 13 amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to further 14 provide for the law library fee in the county and to ratify, 15 approve, validate and confirm any court costs levied pursuant to local law enacted prior to the adoption of this amendment. 16 "Proposed by Act " 17 18 This description shall be followed by the following language: 19
