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8	To establish an Alabama Purchase of Local

18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the
20	following terms shall have the following meanings:
21	(1) ALABAMA COASTAL WATERS. Those waters, adjacent
22	to the Alabama shoreline, which contain a measurable quantity
23	or percentage of sea water, including, but not limited to,
24	sounds, bays, lagoons, bayous, ponds, and estuaries.
25	(2) ALABAMA COASTAL AREA. The coastal waters,
26	including the lands therein and thereunder, and the adjacent
27	shorelands, including the waters therein and thereunder,

strongly influenced by each and in proximity to the shoreline
of Alabama and including transitional and intertidal areas,
salt marshes, wetlands, and beaches. The area extends seaward
to the outer limit of the United States territorial sea and
extends inland from the shoreline only to the extent necessary
to control shorelands, the uses of which have a direct and
significant impact on the coastal waters.

- 8 (3) ALABAMA AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS. The following 9 products produced in Alabama:
 - a. Agronomic, aquacultural, floricultural, horticultural, silvicultural, and viticultural products, including, but not limited to, the following:

- 1. Plants, fruits, and crops.
- 2. Livestock and dairy products.
- 3. Crawfish, catfish, other fish, shrimp, oysters, crabs, and any other seafood and freshwater food.
 - b. All meat and meat products including beef, veal, pork, mutton, poultry, and their byproducts.
- (4) DEPARTMENT. Department of Agriculture and Industries.
 - (5) PRODUCED IN ALABAMA. Planted, cultivated, grown, caught, or harvested in Alabama, including in Alabama coastal waters, the Alabama coastal area, and in the territorial waters of the state. With regard to seafood, the term shall include anything caught or harvested in waters seaward of the territorial waters of the state by the holder of an Alabama commercial fisherman's license who transports and sells his or

her catch to a licensed Alabama wholesale or retail seafood

dealer located within this state, as well as any seafood

product processed in this state.

- (6) RESTAURANT. A reputable place licensed as a restaurant that meets both of the following criteria:
- a. Is principally used for the purpose of preparing and serving meals for the public to consume on the premises.
- b. Is not primarily devoted to serving alcoholic beverages for consumption by patrons on the premises and in which the serving of food is only incidental to the consumption of beverages.

Section 2. There is hereby created the Alabama

Purchase of Local Agricultural Products Incentive Program

within the Department of Agriculture and Industries to grant
incentive payments to restaurants in this state for purchases

of Alabama agricultural products.

Section 3. (a) There is hereby established a fund in the State Treasury to be known and designated as the Alabama Purchase of Local Agricultural Products Incentive Program Fund. Any public or private grants, gifts, and donations received by the state or the department for the purposes of this act shall be credited to the fund.

(b) Subject to an appropriation by the Legislature, the fund shall be used solely to grant incentive payments under the Alabama Purchase of Local Agricultural Products Incentive Program as provided in this act to eligible restaurants for purchases of Alabama agricultural products and

to pay all ordinary and necessary operating and administrative costs and expenses associated with implementation of this act not to exceed five percent of the monies appropriated from the fund.

(c) The monies in the fund may be invested by the State Treasurer and all monies and interest remaining unexpended in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the State Treasury to be expended as provided by this act.

Section 4. (a) The amount of the incentive payment pursuant to this act shall not exceed four percent of the total costs of the Alabama agricultural products purchased by an eligible restaurant during a fiscal year.

- (b) An application for an incentive payment pursuant to this act shall be provided by the department and shall be submitted by an interested restaurant establishment to the department within the application period set forth by the department based upon the restaurant's purchases of Alabama agricultural products within that fiscal year.
- (c) The department shall promulgate rules as are necessary to implement the provisions of this act including, but not limited to, rules regarding the period within which an application for the incentive shall be submitted in order to be eligible to receive an incentive payment and the documentation required to be maintained and provided by a restaurant applying for the incentive payment. The rules may require a producer of Alabama agricultural products to obtain

a permit issued by the department evidencing that the Alabama agricultural products produced are eligible for incentive payments pursuant to this act.

- (d) A restaurant applying for the incentive payment shall be required to provide and maintain sufficient documentation exhibiting the amount of purchases of Alabama agricultural products and eligibility to claim the incentive payment as determined by the department in rules adopted pursuant to subsection (c).
- (e) Payment of any incentives pursuant to this act shall be contingent on funds being available in the Alabama Purchase of Local Agricultural Products Incentive Program Fund to pay the incentive payment. If there is insufficient money in the Alabama Purchase of Local Agricultural Products Incentive Program Fund to fully satisfy all timely filed applications for incentive payments, incentive payments shall be distributed to the applicants on a prorated basis based upon the proportion of Alabama agricultural products purchased by the applicant to the total amount of purchases by all applicants.

Section 5. The program and fund created by this act shall terminate on September 30, 2015. No rebate payments authorized under this act shall be granted after September 30, 2015. Any unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of the program shall revert to the General Fund of the state.

Section 6. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
