27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1	Section 1. Section 13A-7-25, Code of Alabama 1975,
2	is amended to read as follows:
3	"§13A-7-25.
4	"(a) A person commits the crime of criminal
5	tampering in the first degree if, having the person does any
6	of the following:
7	"(1) Having no right to do so or any reasonable
8	ground to believe that he or she has such a right, he
9	intentionally causes substantial interruption or impairment of
10	a service rendered to the public by a utility.
11	"(2) Threatens an individual with a deadly weapon,
12	dangerous instrument, or dangerous animal with the intent to
13	obstruct the operation of a utility.
14	"(b) Criminal tampering in the first degree is a
15	Class C felony."
16	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
17	first day of the third month following its passage and
18	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
