13 Relating to the City of Anniston, Alabama;
14 authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages within the city
15 limits each day of the week by properly licensed clubs and
16 retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and
17 to provide for the off-premises sale of alcoholic beverages;
18 to authorize the governing body of the city to regulate the
19 selling of alcoholic beverages to the general public by
20 properly licensed retailers.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

22 Section 1. This act only applies to the City of
23 Anniston and provides for the Anniston Ecotourism Beverage
24 Bill.

25 Section 2. Alcoholic beverages may be sold each day
26 of the week for on-premises consumption by licensed clubs and
27 retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board in

1 the City of Anniston if approved by a majority vote of the
2 governing body.

3 Section 3. Alcoholic beverages may be sold each day
4 of the week for off-premises consumption by licensed clubs and
5 retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board
6 within the City of Anniston if approved by a majority vote of
7 the governing body.

8 Section 4. The governing body of the City of
9 Anniston, by resolution or ordinance passed by a simple
10 majority, may regulate but may not prohibit the sale of both
11 on-premises and off-premises consumption of alcoholic
12 beverages each day of the week by licensed clubs and retail
13 licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to the
14 general public. Licensed clubs and retail licensees granted a
15 license may sell or dispense alcoholic beverages pursuant to
16 the requirements of the license and applicable regulations of
17 the board.

18 Section 5. The provisions of this act are cumulative
19 and supplemental to the present power and authority of the
20 City of Anniston and are not intended to, nor shall it be
21 interpreted so as to, repeal any existing power or authority
22 of the governing body with this act that are now permitted
23 under the general laws of the state or under any local or
24 special act of the Legislature.

25 Section 6. This act shall become effective
26 immediately following its passage and approval by the
27 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
