19	"(a) The president or chief executive officer of any
20	state college or university, the president or chief executive
21	officer of the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, the
22	Presidents of Talladega College, Concordia College, Samford
23	University, Birmingham-Southern College, Miles College,
24	Stillman College, Tuskegee University, Spring Hill College,
25	and Selma University may appoint and employ one or more
26	suitable persons to act as police officers to keep off
27	intruders and prevent trespass upon and damage to the property

1	of the college or university or of the institute. These			
2	persons shall be charged with all the duties and invested with			
3	all the powers of police officers. Any police officer			
4	appointed by the President of Miles College shall be			
5	restricted to the campus and property of Miles College.			
6	"(b) Any person appointed to act as a police			
7	officer, pursuant to subsection (a), while on duty, shall			
8	carry and be trained in the proper use of a nonlethal weapon.			
9	For the purposes of this subsection, a nonlethal weapon is a			
10	weapon that is explicitly designed and primarily employed to			
11	immediately incapacitate the targeted person while minimizing			
12	fatalities and permanent injury. A nonlethal weapon is			
13	intended to have a reversible effect on the targeted person.			
14	"(b)(c) This section is cumulative."			
15	Section 2. This act shall become effective			
16	immediately following its passage and approval by the			
17	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
