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9 A BILL  
10 TO BE ENTITLED  
11 AN ACT  
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13 Relating to the City of Weaver; authorizing the sale  
14 of alcoholic beverages within the city limits each day of the  
15 week by properly licensed clubs and retail licensees of the  
16 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and to provide for the  
17 off-premises sale of alcoholic beverages; and to authorize the  
18 governing body of the city to regulate the selling of  
19 alcoholic beverages to the general public by properly licensed  
20 retailers.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

22 Section 1. This act only applies to the City of  
23 Weaver and provides for the City of Weaver Ecotourism Beverage  
24 Bill.

25 Section 2. Alcoholic beverages may be sold each day  
26 of the week for on-premises consumption by licensed clubs and  
27 retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board in

1 the City of Weaver if approved by a majority vote of the  
2 governing body.

3 Section 3. Alcoholic beverages may be sold each day  
4 of the week for off-premises consumption by licensed clubs and  
5 retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board  
6 within the City of Weaver if approved by a majority vote of  
7 the governing body.

8 Section 4. The governing body of the City of Weaver,  
9 by resolution or ordinance passed by a simple majority, may  
10 regulate, but may not prohibit, the sale of both on-premises  
11 and off-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages each day  
12 of the week by licensed clubs and retail licensees of the  
13 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to the general public.  
14 Licensed clubs and retail licensees granted a license may sell  
15 or dispense alcoholic beverages pursuant to the requirements  
16 of the license and applicable regulations of the board.

17 Section 5. The provisions of this act are cumulative  
18 and supplemental to the present power and authority of the  
19 City of Weaver and are not intended to, nor shall it be  
20 interpreted so as to, repeal any existing power or authority  
21 of the governing body with this act that are now permitted  
22 under the general laws of the state or under any local or  
23 special act of the Legislature.

24 Section 6. This act shall become effective  
25 immediately following its passage and approval by the  
26 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
