13	Relating to the City of Weaver; authorizing the sale

21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. This act only applies to the City of
23	Weaver and provides for the City of Weaver Ecotourism Beverage
24	Bill.
25	Section 2. Alcoholic beverages may be sold each day
26	of the week for on-premises consumption by licensed clubs and
27	retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board in

the City of Weaver if approved by a majority vote of the governing body.

Section 3. Alcoholic beverages may be sold each day of the week for off-premises consumption by licensed clubs and retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board within the City of Weaver if approved by a majority vote of the governing body.

Section 4. The governing body of the City of Weaver, by resolution or ordinance passed by a simple majority, may regulate, but may not prohibit, the sale of both on-premises and off-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages each day of the week by licensed clubs and retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to the general public.

Licensed clubs and retail licensees granted a license may sell or dispense alcoholic beverages pursuant to the requirements of the license and applicable regulations of the board.

Section 5. The provisions of this act are cumulative and supplemental to the present power and authority of the City of Weaver and are not intended to, nor shall it be interpreted so as to, repeal any existing power or authority of the governing body with this act that are now permitted under the general laws of the state or under any local or special act of the Legislature.

Section 6. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
