This bill would remove the prohibition on the election or appointment of members of the Public Service Commission from the same congressional district.

Relating to residency of certain public officials; to amend Sections 12-3-5, 36-2-4, 37-1-3, and 37-1-9, Code of Alabama 1975; to remove the requirement that the judges of the appellate courts reside in Montgomery during terms of court; to require certain public officials to reside in a location that enables them to access their office or post within a single day of travel; and to remove the prohibition on electing or appointing members of the Public Service Commission from the same congressional district. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 12-3-5, 36-2-4, 37-1-3, and 37-1-9, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: 1 "\$12-3-5.

"The judges of the courts shall reside in Montgomery during the terms of the courts or live in or sufficiently near to the City of Montgomery so that their offices are accessible in a single day of travel.

"§36-2-4.

"Every state official or officer holding office under the authority of this state and who is paid a salary or receives pecuniary profit for his services as such official and whose office or post of duty is located in the Capitol building or in the City of Montgomery shall reside or live in or sufficiently near to the City of Montgomery so that such his or her office or post of duty shall be reasonably is accessible to him daily in a single day of travel.

"§37-1-3.

"(a) The terms of office of the commissioners shall be for four years; at the election to be held in the state on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1940, and every four years thereafter, a president of said commission shall be elected by the qualified electors of this state; and at the election to be held in the state on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1942, and every four years thereafter, two associates, who, with the president, shall constitute said commission, shall be elected by the qualified electors of the state. The result of such election shall be ascertained and declared by the same authority and in the same manner as are the results of

election for chief justice and associate justices of the supreme court.

"(b) The persons elected to fill said offices shall enter upon the discharge of their respective duties on the day after the general election at which they are elected and expire on the day after the general election held in the fourth year after their election.

"(c) If any vacancy should occur in any one of said offices, caused by death, resignation or otherwise, the same shall be filled by appointment by the Governor, the appointee holding for the balance of the unexpired term. If any person elected to the office of public service commissioner shall fail or refuse for 30 days to qualify, such failure or refusal shall be held to create a vacancy in the office, which vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the Governor, the appointee to hold for the term for which the person so failing or refusing to qualify was elected.

"(d) No two of said public service commissioners
shall be elected or appointed from the same congressional
district. But this section shall not disqualify or render
ineligible for election or appointment any person holding such
office on the date of enactment or effective date of any law
redistricting the state for election of representatives in
Congress.

" $\frac{(e)}{(d)}$  The provisions of this section shall not diminish the current term of any member elected to the Public Service Commission.

"§37-1-9. 1 2 "Each member of the commission shall devote his or her whole time to his or her official business and shall 3 reside at the state capital during the time he continues in office, except during epidemics or live in or sufficiently 5 near to the City of Montgomery so that his or her office is 6 7 accessible in a single day of travel." Section 2. This act shall become effective 8 immediately following its passage and approval by the 9 10 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
