8 SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, the owner or owners of property abutting a county road or city street may petition the local governing body to vacate the road or street. The law provides that the voting procedures which apply before the local governing body are the same voting procedures which apply when the local governing body proposes to vacate a road or street. This law also requires that, in the case of a county road, the county commissioner in whose district the road is located is required to make the motion to vacate the road.

This bill would specify that when the members of a family who own the abutting property on both sides of a county road or portion of a county road petition the county commission to vacate the county road or portion of the county road, any member of the county commission may make the motion to approve the petition and vacate the road or portion of the road.

14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
15	Section 1. Section 23-4-20 of the Code of Alabama
16	1975, is amended to read as follows:

18	"(a) Subject to subsection (c) and the conditions
19	set out in this subsection, any street or alley may be
20	vacated, in whole or in part, by the owner or owners of the
21	land abutting the street or alley or abutting that portion of
22	the street or alley desired to be vacated by following the
23	procedures set out herein. The owner or owners of the land
24	abutting the street or alley to be vacated shall join in a
25	written petition requesting that the street or alley be

thereof, requesting the governing body's approval of the vacation. Following receipt of the written request for assent, the governing body shall act upon the request applying the same notice, hearing, voting, and appeal procedures as set forth in Sections 23-4-2 and 23-4-5, and if the governing body approves the vacation, it shall have the same effect as provided therein, including that the vacation shall not deprive other property owners of any right they may have to convenient and reasonable means of ingress and egress to and from their property, and if that right is not afforded by the remaining streets and alleys, another street or alley affording that right must be dedicated.

"(b) The provisions of this section shall not be held to repeal any existing statute relating to the vacation of roads, streets, or alleys, or parts thereof, and shall not be held to limit or expand any civil causes of action available under the law.

"(c) Notwithstanding any provision of subsection (a) or Section 23-4-2, if the owners of family-owned property abutting both sides of a county road or portion of a county road petition the county commission to vacate the county road or portion of the county road, any member of the county commission may make a motion to approve the petition."

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
