Section 2. The Code Commissioner shall identify any board, commission, council, task force, or similar entity that is defunct or has been inactive by not holding a meeting within the last four years of the effective date of this act and report the list of such entities to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate on or before January 1, 2016, for consideration of a repeal of any law or resolution granting authority to such board, commission, council, task force, or similar entity.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
