12	in-service training on the use and operation of AEDs.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 6-5-332.3, Code of Alabama 1975,
15	is amended to read as follows:
16	<b>"</b> §6-5-332.3.
17	"(a) The Legislature of the State of Alabama finds
18	the following:
19	"(1) Early defibrillation may sustain the life and
20	temporarily stabilize a person in cardiac arrest, thus helping
21	to preserve the Alabama family.
22	"(2) The American Heart Association estimates that
23	more than 350,000 Americans die each year from out of hospital
24	sudden cardiac arrest, and 20,000 deaths may be prevented each
25	year if automated external defibrillators were more widely
26	<del>available.</del>

1	"(b) It is the intent of the Legislature that an
2	automated external defibrillator may be used for the purpose
3	of saving the life of another person in cardiac arrest.
4	" $\frac{(c)}{(a)}$ As used in Section 6-5-332, the term
5	"automated external defibrillator" or "AED" means a medical
6	device heart monitor and defibrillator that meets all of the
7	following specifications:
8	"(1) Has received approval of its pre-market
9	notification filed pursuant to Section 360 (k), Title 21 of
10	the United States Code from the United States Food and Drug
11	Administration Is commercially distributed in accordance with
12	the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. Section
13	301, et seq.).
14	"(2) Is capable of recognizing the presence or
15	absence of ventricular fibrillation or rapid ventricular
16	tachycardia and is capable of determining, without
17	intervention by an operator, whether defibrillation should be
18	performed.
19	"(3) Upon determining that defibrillation should be
20	performed, semiautomatically or automatically charges and
21	requests delivery of delivers an electrical impulse through
22	the chest wall and to an individual's heart.
23	"(d)(b) A person or entity that acquires an AED
24	shall ensure all of the following:
25	"(1) That expected defibrillator users receive
26	appropriate training in an American Heart Association,
27	American Red Cross, or other nationally recognized

1	cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) course and AED, or an
2	equivalent nationally recognized course are encouraged to
3	successfully complete a course in automated external
4	defibrillation and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) that is
5	offered or approved by a nationally recognized organization
6	and includes instruction on psychomotor skills and national
7	evidence-based emergency cardiovascular guidelines that are
8	current.
9	"(2) That the defibrillator is maintained and tested
10	according to the manufacturer's operational guidelines.
11	"(3) That there is involvement of a licensed
12	physician or medical authority in the site's AED program to
13	ensure compliance with training, notification, and
14	maintenance.
15	"(4) That any person who renders emergency care or
16	treatment of a person in cardiac arrest by using an AED
17	activates the emergency medical services system as soon as
18	<del>possible</del> .
19	"(5) That each manufacturer, wholesale supplier, or
20	retailer of an AED notifies purchasers of AED's intended for
21	use in the State of Alabama of the requirements of this
22	<del>section.</del>
23	"(c) Each manufacturer shall provide in-service
24	training materials on the AED use and operation to each person
25	or entity who acquires the AED.
26	" <del>(e)</del> (d) A person or entity who acquires an automated
27	external defibrillator shall notify the local emergency

1 communications center or dispatch center of the existing 2 location and type of AED distributor of the AED if any change 3 of ownership of the AED occurs. "(f)(e) This section shall not apply to an individual using an AED in an emergency setting if that 5 individual is acting as a good samaritan pursuant to Section 6 7 6-5-332." Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 8 first day of the third month following its passage and 9

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
