A BILL

10 TO BE ENTITLED

11 AN ACT

13 Relating to Cherokee County; to amend Act 97-652,  
14 1997 Regular Session, now appearing as Section 45-10-111.01 of  
15 the Code of Alabama 1975; to further provide for the mileage  
16 allowance of returning officers.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

18 Section 1. Act 97-652, 1997 Regular Session, now  
19 appearing as Section 45-10-111.01 of the Code of Alabama 1975,  
20 is amended to read as follows:

21 "§45-10-111.01.

22 "(a) This section shall apply only to Cherokee  
23 County.

24 "(b) All returning officers, as appointed by the  
25 local appointing board, the judge of probate, sheriff, and  
26 circuit clerk, shall receive an additional compensation of ten  
27 dollars (\$10) and shall receive ~~twenty-five cents (\$.25)~~ the

1        ~~same per mile~~ the same mileage allowance for travel as the  
2        state mileage allowance provided for in Section 36-7-22, from  
3        the location of the polling place to the courthouse and  
4        return.

5                "(c) The judge of probate shall determine the number  
6        of miles for returning officers to receive payment for mileage  
7        pursuant to subsection (b).

8                "(d) The additional compensation shall be paid to  
9        the returning officers, one person per precinct box, on each  
10        federal, state, county, or special election held in the  
11        county.

12               "(e) The provisions of this section are in addition  
13        to statewide compensation for election officials as specified  
14        by Section 17-6-13."

15               Section 2. This act shall become effective on the  
16        first day of the third month following its passage and  
17        approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
