13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 9-11-54, Code of Alabama 1975, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	<b>"</b> §9-11-54.
17	"(a) Any person who is totally and permanently
18	disabled and receiving disability retirement from a public or
19	private entity or a disability benefit from the federal Social
20	Security Administration, the United States Railroad
21	Retirement, the United States Office of Personnel Management,
22	the Retirement Systems of Alabama, or a unit of federal,
23	state, or local government designated by rule of the
24	department and who has been a bona fide resident of this state
25	for not less than six months 90 days next preceding the date
26	of application may, upon the payment of an annual license fee
27	as provided in subsection (b), plus an issuance fee of \$1.00

one dollar (\$1), procure a special disabled person's fishing or hunting license in the following manner: The applicant shall file with the person, in the county in which he or she resides, who is duly authorized to issue licenses, an application, stating his or her age, place of residence, post office address, and length of residence in this state. The application shall have attached a sworn statement by a licensed physician or chiropractor of this state stating that the applicant is totally disabled evidence of the receipt of disability benefits as may be required by rule.

"(b) The fishing licenses issued pursuant to this section shall be valid on a continuous basis during the period of total disability; provided, however, that any conservation enforcement officer may, upon reasonable belief that the license holder is no longer totally disabled, request the holder to obtain a recertification of disability, which request shall be in writing. Upon the failure of the holder to furnish the recertification of disability within 90 days of receipt of request, the holder's license shall be void and shall be confiscated by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries. For purposes of this section, annual license fees shall be as follows:

- "(1) Hunting license: five dollars (\$5).
- "(2) Freshwater fishing license: two dollars (\$2).
- "(3) Saltwater fishing license: two dollars (\$2).

1	"(c) The annual license and issuance fees provided
2	in this section shall be subject to adjustment as provided in
3	<u>Section 9-11-68.</u>
4	"(d) The license application process, including, but
5	not limited to, providing proof of residency and disability
6	status, may be established by rule.
7	"(e)(1)a. A fishing license issued pursuant to this
8	section shall be in lieu of the annual resident fishing

17	"(2) This section does not supersede any additional
18	license or requirement to hunt on state-operated wildlife
19	management areas, as provided in Section 9-11-45 or to hunt
20	migratory waterfowl, as provided in Section 9-11-433.
21	"(3) An annual resident hunting or freshwater
22	fishing license for a person with a disability shall entitle
23	the license holder to all of the privileges of the wildlife
24	heritage license.
25	" <del>(c)</del> <u>(f)</u> The issuing officer or authority shall be
26	allowed an issuance fee of $\$1.00$ one dollar $(\$1)$ for each
27	license issued. In counties in which the probate judge or

issuing officer is on a fee system, the issuing fee shall be retained by the probate judge or issuing officer, and in a county in which the probate judge or issuing officer is on a salary basis, the issuing fee shall be paid into the county treasury. These licenses shall not be issued by special agents. The name of the physician certifying to the disability of the licensee shall be written upon the license.

"disabled" means inability to engage in any substantial gainful activity by reason of any medically determinable physical impairment which can be expected to result in death or in blindness or to be of long continued and indefinite duration. The term "blindness," as used in this section, means central visual acuity of 5/200 or less in the better eye with the use of a corrective lens. An eye in which the visual field is reduced to five degrees or less concentric contraction shall be considered for the purposes of this section as having a central visual acuity of 5/200 or less. No applicant shall be considered disabled unless he or she furnishes the required medical statement setting out the fact of such disability."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
