13	to a traffic accident to a driver involved in the accident

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. Section 32-5-171, Code of Alabama 1975,
17	is amended to read as follows:
18	<b>"</b> §32-5-171.
19	"(a) A uniformed police officer, state trooper,
20	county sheriff, or his or her deputy or member of a municipal
21	police force law enforcement officer as defined in Section
22	36-21-40, may arrest, at the scene of subsequent to a traffic
23	accident, any driver of a vehicle involved in the accident if
24	upon personal investigation, including information from
25	eyewitnesses, the officer has reasonable grounds to believe
26	that the person by violating Section 32-5A-191 contributed to
27	the accident. He or she may arrest such a person without a

1	warrant although he or she did not personally see the
2	violation.
3	"(b) A law enforcement officer as defined in Section
4	36-21-40, subsequent to a traffic accident, may issue a
5	traffic citation to a driver of a vehicle involved in the
6	accident when, based on personal investigation, the officer
7	has reasonable and probable grounds to believe that the person
8	has committed any offense under this title. Chapters 5, 5A, 6,
9	7, or 7A of Title 32."
10	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
11	first day of the third month following its passage and
12	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
