15 A BILL

16 TO BE ENTITLED

17 AN ACT

18

19 Relating to information technology; to amend  
20 Sections 41-28-1 and 41-28-3, Code of Alabama 1975, relating  
21 to information technology and the Information Services  
22 Division of the Department of Finance to transfer this  
23 division to the Office of Information Technology.

24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

25 Section 1. (a) The Legislature finds and declares:

26 (1) The streamlining and consolidation of

27 governmental functions is a priority and is of great

1 importance to the economic well-being of the State of Alabama,  
2 to its citizens, and to ensuring appropriate and responsible  
3 use of taxpayer funds.

4 (2) The Office of Information Technology was created  
5 in furtherance of the goal to streamline information  
6 technology in the state.

7 (3) Effective utilization of information technology  
8 is paramount to reducing the cost of governmental operations  
9 and to serving the citizens of the state.

10 (4) Excellence in support for all state agency  
11 information technology needs is critical to serving the people  
12 of Alabama.

13 (b) To implement the findings in subsection (a), the  
14 purpose of this act is to transfer the responsibility and  
15 authority for information technology service delivery from the  
16 Department of Finance to the Office of Information Technology.

17 Section 2. Sections 41-28-1 and 41-28-3, Code of  
18 Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

19 "§41-28-1.

20 ~~"The Office of Secretary of Information Technology~~  
21 ~~is created as a cabinet level position not requiring the~~  
22 ~~approval of the Alabama Legislature. The secretary shall have~~  
23 ~~the duties, responsibilities, functions, powers, and authority~~  
24 ~~set forth in this chapter and as otherwise provided by law.~~  
25 There is in state government the Office of Information  
26 Technology, which shall be headed by the Secretary of  
27 Information Technology.

1                   "§41-28-3.

2                   "(a) The Secretary of Information Technology shall  
3 be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Governor. The  
4 Secretary of Information Technology is a cabinet level  
5 position and the secretary shall be responsible for the  
6 performance and exercise of the duties, responsibilities,  
7 functions, powers, and authority imposed upon the Secretary of  
8 Information Technology and the Office of Information  
9 Technology by law and shall be the state Chief Information  
10 Officer (CIO) and the principal advisor to the Governor on  
11 information technology policy, including policy on the  
12 acquisition and management of information technology and  
13 resources. The Secretary of Information Technology shall be in  
14 the unclassified service of the state Merit System and shall  
15 receive a salary in an amount to be determined by the  
16 Governor.

17                   "(b) ~~The Secretary of Information Technology may~~  
18 ~~employ all personnel of the Office of the Secretary of~~  
19 ~~Information Technology, subject to the state Merit System, or~~  
20 ~~if the employee is to be employed in a supervisory capacity,~~  
21 ~~without regard to the provisions thereof. If supervisors are~~  
22 ~~employed outside the state Merit System, the Secretary of~~  
23 ~~Information Technology shall set the compensation of such~~  
24 ~~employees in accordance with that of comparable positions~~  
25 ~~established under the state Merit System play plan. Before~~  
26 ~~entering upon the discharge of his or her duties, the~~  
27 ~~secretary shall take the constitutional oath of office and~~

1           shall execute to the State of Alabama a bond, to be approved  
2           by the Governor, in an amount to be fixed by the Governor, but  
3           not less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), for the  
4           faithful performance of the secretary's duties.

5           "(c) The employees of the office shall be either  
6           members of the classified service of the Merit System or  
7           exempt from the Merit System. In addition to any other exempt  
8           positions as otherwise allowed by law, the exempt positions in  
9           the office shall include:

10           "(1) Up to four deputy secretaries.

11           "(2) Up to 12 highly trained, highly specialized  
12           information technology professionals.

13           "(3) A Director of Broadband Development.

14           "(d) Employees of the office in the exempt service  
15           shall serve at the pleasure of the secretary and,  
16           notwithstanding Section 36-6-6, shall receive salaries to be  
17           determined by the secretary.

18           "(c) If existing positions or divisions of state  
19           government are consolidated or eliminated as a result of the  
20           creation of the office, any state employees displaced may be  
21           offered the opportunity to transfer to available positions  
22           within the office for which they are qualified."

23           Section 3. (a) Effective October 1, 2017, the  
24           Information Services Division of the Department of Finance,  
25           which was established on March 19, 1997, by the Director of  
26           Finance with the approval of the Governor pursuant to Section  
27           41-4-37, Code of Alabama 1975, and which thereby assumed the

1 authority, powers, and duties of, and succeeded to, the  
2 divisions of Data Systems Management and Telecommunications of  
3 the Department of Finance, is abolished. All powers,  
4 authority, and duties of the Information Services Division,  
5 including, but not limited, to those authorities currently  
6 established in Articles 8 and 11 of Chapter 4 of Title 41,  
7 Code of Alabama 1975, are hereby transferred to the Office of  
8 Information Technology. All references in any law or rule to  
9 the Division of Data Systems Management, the  
10 Telecommunications Division, or the Information Services  
11 Division of the Department of Finance shall be deemed a  
12 reference to the Office of Information Technology. In any law  
13 or rule relating to the Division of Data Systems Management,  
14 the Telecommunications Division, or the Information Services  
15 Division, all references to the Department of Finance shall be  
16 deemed a reference to the Office of Information Technology,  
17 and all references to the Director of Finance shall be deemed  
18 a reference to the Secretary of Information Technology.

19 (b) All books, records, supplies, funds, equipment,  
20 and personnel of the Information Services Division of the  
21 Department of Finance shall be transferred to the Office of  
22 Information Technology.

23 (c) All persons employed by the Department of  
24 Finance who are identified by the Finance Director as  
25 employees of the Information Services Division on October 1,  
26 2017, shall be transferred to the Office of Information  
27 Technology. Such transfer shall result without loss of salary,

1       benefits, seniority, or decrease in Merit System  
2       classification.

3                   Section 4. In addition to any other authority, the  
4       Department of Finance, Division of Purchasing, is hereby  
5       authorized to enter into joint purchasing agreements for  
6       information technology goods and services and make  
7       multi-vendor awards for information technology goods and  
8       services on behalf of the Office of Information Technology.

9                   Section 5. The Code Commissioner shall conform  
10      references in the Code of Alabama 1975, to the units,  
11      departments, divisions, and other state entities included in  
12      this act to reflect the changes required by this act. Code  
13      changes shall be made at a time determined to be appropriate  
14      by the Code Commissioner.

15                  Section 6. This act shall become effective on  
16      October 1, 2017, following its passage and approval by the  
17      Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
