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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, parents and guardians of
9		children in schools are required to vaccinate their
10		children, with some exceptions.
11		Existing law provides an exception to this
12		requirement for the vaccination of schoolchildren
13		if the parent or guardian objects in writing on
14		grounds that vaccination or testing for illnesses
15		conflicts with his or her religious beliefs, except
16		during an epidemic.
17		This bill would establish the My Child, My
18		Choice Vaccination Act.
19		This bill would exempt a parent or guardian
20		from the vaccination or testing requirement for
21		religious grounds even during an epidemic.
22		This bill would extend the exemption from
23		required vaccination or testing to those with
24		sincerely held personal beliefs conflicting with
25		vaccination or testing.
26		This bill would require communications to
27		students or parents from public PreK-12 schools and

local boards of education regarding any vaccination requirements to contain information on grounds for exemption from the requirements.

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This bill would require local superintendents of education to make monthly reports to the State Superintendent of Education regarding reports pertaining to violations of this bill's provisions.

This bill would require a reduction in Foundation Program Fund monies for violations.

Under existing law, there is no requirement that students of public two-year and four-year institutions of higher education receive vaccinations, but several of these institutions require vaccinations for admission for students.

This bill would require public two-year and four-year institutions of higher education that require vaccinations for students to provide exemptions to those requirements.

This bill would require communications to students and parents of minor students from public two-year and four-year institutions of higher education regarding any vaccination requirements to contain information on grounds for exemption from the requirements.

This bill would require a reduction in state

funding for public two-year and four-year

institutions of higher education for violations.

This bill would also require the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts, when conducting audits of public PreK-12 schools and public two-year and four-year institutions of higher education, to include information regarding violations of this bill by those schools and institutions in the audit reports.

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Relating to vaccination of students; to amend

Section 16-30-3, Code of Alabama 1975; to establish the My

Child, My Choice Vaccination Act; to provide an exemption from

mandatory vaccination or testing for schoolchildren to parents

or guardians who sincerely hold personal beliefs conflicting

with immunization or testing, and to allow that exemption at

all times; to require certain communications from public

PreK-12 schools to contain certain information; to require

certain monthly reporting by local superintendents of

education to the State Superintendent of Education; to require

a reduction in funding for public PreK-12 schools and local

boards of education in certain cases; to require public

institutions of higher education that require immunizations 1 2 for students to provide exemptions in certain circumstances; to require certain communications from public institutions of 3 higher education to contain certain information; to require a 4 5 reduction in funding for public institutions of higher 6 education in certain cases; and to require the Department of 7 Examiners of Public Accounts to include certain information in audit reports regarding public PreK-12 schools and public institutions of higher education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This bill shall be known as and may be cited as the My Child, My Choice Vaccination Act.

Section 2. Section 16-30-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$16-30-3.

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"The provisions of this chapter shall not apply if when either of the following are true:

- "(1) In the absence of an epidemic or immediate threat thereof, the The parent or guardian of the child shall object thereto objects in writing on grounds that such the immunization or testing conflicts with his or her religious tenets and practices or sincerely held personal beliefs.; or
- "(2) Certification by a A competent medical authority providing provides certification for an individual exemption from the required immunization or testing is presented to the admissions officer of the school."

Section 3. (a) Any communication provided to students or parents by a public PreK-12 school or local board of education regarding immunization requirements shall include information describing the circumstances under which an exemption from the immunization requirements as provided in Section 16-30-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is permitted. The exemption information and immunization requirements shall be provided in the same font, size, and style, and located on the same page of the written or digital communication.

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- (b) (1) The State Board of Education shall develop a standardized complaint form for violations of subsection (a) by public PreK-12 schools or local boards of education and shall include instructions for how complaints should be filed with a local superintendent of education.
- (2) Complaint forms shall be made accessible on the websites of local boards of education and the State Board of Education.
- (c) (1) Each local superintendent of education shall report monthly to the State Superintendent of Education the names of those schools located under his or her jurisdiction for which he or she has both received and verified reports of violations of subsection (a).
- (2) Each local superintendent of education shall also report monthly to the State Superintendent of Education regarding instances of received and verified reports of violations of subsection (a) by the local board of education.

(d) (1) If a public PreK-12 school violates subsection (a), the State Superintendent of Education shall reduce by one thousand dollars (\$1,000), for the succeeding fiscal year, the portion of that local board of education's allotment from the Foundation Program Fund to which that school would otherwise be entitled, per violation. The reduction shall only apply to the violating school and sufficient safeguards shall be implemented to ensure that the reduction does not decrease or supplant funding to any other school under the jurisdiction of the local board of education.

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- (2) If a local board of education violates subsection (a), the State Superintendent of Education shall reduce by one thousand dollars (\$1,000), in the succeeding fiscal year, that local board of education's allotment from the Foundation Program Fund, per violation.
- Section 4. (a) (1) A public two-year or four-year institution of higher education that requires a student to receive a vaccination shall provide an exemption to a student if either of the following are true:
- a. The student objects in writing on grounds that the vaccination conflicts with his or her religious tenets and practices or sincerely held religious beliefs.
- b. A competent medical authority provides certification for an individual exemption from the required vaccination.
- (2) Any communication provided to students or parents of students by a public two-year or four-year

institution of higher education regarding vaccination
requirements shall include information describing the
circumstances under which an exemption from its vaccination
requirements is permitted. The exemption information and
vaccination requirements shall be provided in the same font,
size, and style, and located on the same page of the written
or digital communication.

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- (b) (1) The boards of trustees of each public two-year or four-year institution of higher education shall develop a standardized complaint form for violations of subsection (a) by those institutions, and shall include instructions for how complaints should be filed with the boards of trustees.
- (2) Complaint forms shall be made accessible on the websites of the boards of trustees of each public two-year or four-year institution of higher education.
- (c) If a public two-year or four-year institution of higher education violates this section, state funding for that institution shall be reduced by one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per violation in the succeeding fiscal year.
- (d) It is the intent of the Legislature that constitutionally created boards of trustees comply with the requirements of this section.
- Section 5. When auditing a public PreK-12 school or a public two-year or four-year institution of higher education, the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts

shall include in the audit report any violations of Section 16-30-3, Code of Alabama 1975, or Sections 1 through 4. Section 6. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
