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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, a person is guilty of
9		human trafficking if the person, among other
10		things, benefits financially from subjecting
11		another person to sexual servitude. Sexual
12		servitude is defined to require coercion or
13		deception from the perpetrator of the crime.
14		Also under existing law, coercion or
15		deception is not required if the victim is a minor.
16		This bill would further provide for the
17		crime of human trafficking and would provide that
18		coercion or deception is not required if the victim
19		is incapable of consent by reason of being
20		incapacitated.
21		This bill would also further provide for the
22		meaning of sexual servitude as it relates to human
23		trafficking to include sodomy and sexual torture as
24		forms of sexual conduct obtained as a result of
25		deception of coercion.
26		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
27		of 1901, as amended by Amendment 890, now appearing

as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of 1 2 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, 3 prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure 5 of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by 6 a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the 8 9 affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates 10 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose. 11

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment.

However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

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Relating to human trafficking; to amend Section 13A-6-151, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for definitions associated with human trafficking; and in

connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the 1 2 requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of 3 Alabama of 1901, as amended by Amendment 890, now appearing as 4 5 Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended. 6 7

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 13A-6-151, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: 9

"\$13A-6-151.

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"As used in this article, the following terms shall have the following, or any combination of the following, meanings ascribed to them by this section:

"(1) COERCION. Any of the following:

"a. Causing or threatening to cause physical injury or mental suffering to any person, physically restraining or confining any person, or threatening to physically restrain or confine any person or otherwise causing the person performing or providing labor or services to believe that the person or another person will suffer physical injury, or mental suffering, physical restraint, or confinement.

"b. Implementing any scheme, plan, or pattern intended to cause a person to believe that failure to perform an act would result in physical injury, mental suffering, or physical restraint of any person.

"c. Destroying, concealing, removing, confiscating, or withholding from the person or another person, or

threatening to destroy, conceal, remove, confiscate, or
withhold from the person or another person, the person's or
any person's actual or purported government records,
immigration documents, identifying information, or personal or

real property.

- "d. Exposing or threatening to expose any fact or information that if revealed would tend to subject a person to criminal prosecution, criminal or immigration proceedings, hatred, contempt, or ridicule.
 - "e. Threatening to report the person or another person to immigration officials or to other law enforcement officials or otherwise blackmailing or extorting the person or another person.
 - "f. Use or threatened use of a law or legal process, whether administrative, civil, or criminal, in any manner for any purpose for which the law was not designed, in order to exert pressure on another person to cause that person or another person to take some action or refrain from taking some action.
 - "f. g. Controlling a person's access to medications or a controlled substance, as the term is defined in Section 20-2-2.
- "g. h. Rape, or sodomy, or any other sex offense

 pursuant to Section 15-20A-5, or attempted or threatened rape,

 or sodomy, or any other sex offense pursuant to Section

 15-20A-5 of any person, as defined in this title.
 - "(2) DECEPTION. Any of the following:

"a. Creating or confirming an impression of any
existing fact or past event which is false and which the
accused knows or believes to be false.

"b. Exerting financial control over the person or another person by placing the person or another person under the actor's control as a security or payment of a debt, if the value of the services as reasonably assessed is not applied toward the liquidation of the debt or the length and nature of those services are not respectively limited and defined or the principal amount of the debt does not reasonably reflect the value of the items or services for which debt was incurred or by preventing a person from acquiring information pertinent to the disposition of the debt, referenced in this paragraph.

"c. Promising benefits or the performance of services which the accused does not intend to be delivered. Evidence of failure to deliver benefits or perform services standing alone shall not be sufficient to authorize a conviction under this article.

"d. Using any scheme, plan, or pattern, whether overt or subtle, intended to cause any person to believe that, if the person did not perform such labor, services, acts, or performances, the person or another person would suffer physical injury or mental suffering.

"(3) LABOR SERVITUDE. Work or service of economic or financial value which is performed or provided by another person and is induced or obtained by coercion or deception.

1	"(4) MENTAL SUFFERING. A high degree of mental pain
2	or emotional disturbances, such as distress, anxiety, public
3	humiliation, or psychosomatic physical symptoms. It is more
4	than mere disappointment, anger, resentment, wounded pride, or
5	embarrassment and must be a direct result of the crime of
6	human trafficking.
7	"(5) MINOR. A person under the age of 19.
8	"(6) PHYSICAL INJURY. Impairment of physical
9	condition or substantial pain.
10	"(7) SEXUAL CONDUCT. Any of the following acts:
11	"a. Sexual Intercourse. This term shall have its
12	ordinary meaning and occurs upon a penetration, however
13	slight; emission is not required.
14	"b. Sodomy. As defined under Section 13A-6-60.
15	"bc. Sexual Contact. As defined under Section
16	13A-6-60. Any known touching for the purpose of sexual
17	arousal, gratification , or abuse of the following:
18	"1. The sexual or other intimate parts of the victim
19	by the actor.
20	"2. The sexual or other intimate part of the actor
21	by the victim.
22	"3. The clothing covering the immediate area of the
23	sexual or other intimate parts of the victim or actor.
24	"d. Sexual torture. As defined under Section
25	13A-6-65.1.
26	" c. <u>e.</u> Sexually Explicit Performances. An act or
27	show intended to arouse, satisfy the sexual desires of, or

appeal to the prurient interests of patrons or viewers,
whether public or private, live, photographed, recorded,

3 videotaped, or projected over the Internet.

"d. \underline{f} . Commercial Sex Acts. Any sex act on account of which anything of value is given, promised to, or received, directly or indirectly, by any person.

"(8) SEXUAL SERVITUDE.

"a. Except as provided in paragraph b., any Any sexual conduct as defined in subdivision (3) of Section

14-11-30, for which anything of value is directly or indirectly given, promised to, or received by any person, which conduct is induced or obtained by coercion or deception from a person; provided, however, that if.

"b. If the sexual conduct is with a minor or with any person who is incapable of consent by reason of being incapacitated, as defined in Section 13A-6-60, no coercion or deception is required.

"(9) TRAFFICKING VICTIM. Any person, including minors, subjected to labor servitude, sexual servitude, or involuntary servitude."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, as amended by Amendment 890, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,

- as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.
- 3 Section 3. This act shall become effective January
- 1, 2023, following its passage and approval by the Governor,
- 5 or its otherwise becoming law.
