9		Construction Management within the Department of
10		Finance reviews contracts and inspects for code
11		compliance during certain construction projects at
12		certain educational institutions.
13		Existing law exempts public K-12 schools and
14		four-year universities with a contitutionally
15		created board of trustees conducting certain
16		capital improvement projects valued under \$500,000
17		from approval by the division.
18		This bill would extend that exemption to any
19		K-12 school or four-year university undertaking
20		improvements valued under \$500,000 from approval by
21		the division, but would require inspection of
22		exempted improvements by the division and issuance
23		of recommendations to the school or university by
24		the division relating to compliance with the
25		Americans with Disabilities Act and fire safety or

life safety issues.

This bill would also amend the reporting
requirements for the Division of Construction

Management for each project undertaken at any K-12
school.

This bill would provide a limited exception

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Relating to construction of certain property; to amend Sections 16-1-2.4, 16-1-2.5, 41-4-400, and 41-4-401, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to construction at educational facilities; to further provide for inspection of certain projects at educational facilities by the Division of Construction Management; to further provide for contracts between educational entities and the Division of Construction Management; to further provide for reports by the Division of Construction Management to the Legislature; to provide a limited exception for ongoing projects; and to make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing code language to current style.

27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 16-1-2.4, 16-1-2.5, 41-4-400, 1 2 and 41-4-401, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended by Act 2021-476, 2021 Regular Session, are amended to read as 3 follows: 4 "\$16-1-2.4. 5 "(a) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the 6 7 contrary, the governing board of each educational institution or state educational institution, as defined in Section 8 9 41-4-400(d), shall have full power and authority for, and on 10 behalf of, the State of Alabama to do any or all of the following in relation to that institution: 11 12 "(1) To acquire lands by purchase, condemnation, or 13 otherwise. "(2) To plan for the construction, repair, 14 15 remodeling, enlargement, renovation, furnishing, refurnishing, improvement, or relocation of buildings, structures, and 16 facilities. 17 18 "(3) To set policies, procedures, and guidelines for the design, construction, renovation, equipment, furnishing, 19 20 maintenance, and improvement of all property now owned or 21 hereafter acquired. 22 "(4) To construct, repair, equip, remodel, enlarge, renovate, furnish, refurnish, improve, and locate buildings, 23

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structures, and facilities.

"(5) To enter into contracts or consult with

architects, engineers, contractors, suppliers, and others as

- needed to perform any of the functions provided for in this subsection.
- "(6) To receive any monies, land, or equipment
 donated, appropriated, or otherwise acquired by it for the
 purposes provided for in this subsection.

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- "(7) To charge and provide for collection of user fees for its services. The fees established shall take into consideration the costs of the governing board incurred under this section.
- "(8) To make and adopt all necessary rules, regulations, and plans for its own guidance and for the proper conduct of the duties imposed upon it.
- "(9) To review and approve or disapprove all proposed construction, renovation, or improvement projects for constructability, durability, and maintainability and to ensure the efficient use and availability of funds.
- "(10) To review and administer all design and construction contracts for facilities as provided for in this subsection.
- "(11) To review all emergency project declarations and to aid in the timely execution of emergency projects.
- "(12) To hire architects, inspectors, and any other personnel necessary for the purposes provided for in this subsection or the duties assigned under this section.
- "(b)(1)a. At any public K-12 school or at any four-year public institution of higher education with a constitutionally created board of trustees, any capital

improvement project with an estimated cost certified by a licensed architect or licensed engineer to be no more than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000); any repair or maintenance of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems; and any roofing repair or maintenance or any alterations, additions, repair, or maintenance of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems or any alterations, additions, repair, or maintenance of a roof shall not be subject to approval by the Division of Construction Management within the Department of Finance; provided, that the estimated cost of the project after design completion is certified by a licensed architect or licensed engineer to be no more than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000).

"b.1. For any project exempt from approval pursuant to paragraph a., the governing body of the K-12 school or four-year public institution of higher education shall submit documents to the Division of Construction Management for the sole purpose of review and inspection for compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. § 12-1-1 et seq., and rules and regulations adopted thereunder, and for fire safety and life safety compliance, and issuance of written recommendations to the school or institution at no cost to the school or institution.

"2. The Division of Construction Management shall issue its written recommendations no later than 30 days following receipt of documentation pursuant to subparagraph 1.

If the division is unable to issue recommendations within the

30-day period following receipt of documentation, the

division, prior to the expiration of the 30-day period, shall

issue to the party that submitted the documentation a written

notice explaining the reasons for the delay, and shall issue

the recommendations no later than 45 days following the

original receipt of documentation pursuant to subparagraph 1.

"3. Recommendations issued by the division pursuant to this paragraph shall be maintained by the division as public writings for purposes of Article 3 of Chapter 12 of Title 36.

"b. c. The Division of Construction Management, in consultation with the State Department of Education, shall develop and distribute forms relating to projects subject to this subdivision for use by local boards of education. The department division shall ensure that the use of these forms do alone does not require use of Division of Construction Management services for projects subject to this subdivision, except for the issuance of recommendations pursuant to paragraph b.

"d. For purposes of this subdivision, "fire safety and life safety compliance" means compliance with those provisions of uniform minimum building standards code adopted by the Division of Construction Management pursuant to law that relate to risk of electrical or fire hazards, risk of injury, or illness.

"(2) Any repair or maintenance project with an estimated cost certified by a licensed architect or licensed engineer to be no more than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000); any repair or maintenance of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems; and any roofing repair or maintenance shall not be subject to approval by the governing board of an educational institution or state educational institution.

"(c) All powers, authority, and jurisdiction of the Division of Construction Management or the former Building Commission relating to any educational institution or state educational institution, including, but not limited to, those authorities currently established in Sections 16-1-2.2, 16-16-10(o)(2) and (p), 39-2-2(f)(1), 41-9-243, and 41-16-72(3)(a) through (f), which were previously transferred to the Division of Construction Management within the Department of Finance, are transferred to the governing board of that institution; provided, that the Division of Construction Management shall retain its authority to adopt uniform minimum building standards code for the construction and renovation of facilities at any educational institution or state educational institution.

"The State Department of Education; an educational institution, or a state educational institution, as defined in Section 41-4-400(d); a public K-12 school; or a four-year public institution of higher education with a constitutionally

created board of trustees may contract with the Division of
Construction Management within the Department of Finance for

- "(a) There shall be established within the

 Department of Finance the Division of Construction Management.

 The division shall have full power and authority for, and on behalf of, the State of Alabama to do any or all of the following:
- "(1) To acquire lands by purchase, condemnation, or otherwise.
 - "(2) To plan for the construction, repair, remodeling, enlargement, renovation, furnishing, refurnishing, improvement, or relocation of buildings, structures, and facilities for state departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, agencies, and offices.
 - "(3) To set policies, procedures, and guidelines for the design, construction, renovation, equipment, furnishing, maintenance, and improvement of all property now owned or hereafter acquired by the state or any institution or agency thereof.
 - "(4) To construct, repair, equip, remodel, enlarge, renovate, furnish, refurnish, improve, and locate buildings, structures, and facilities for the use of the State of Alabama or any of its departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, agencies, and offices as in its judgment shall be necessary for state, institutional, or agency purposes.

"(5) To enter into contracts or consult with

architects, engineers, contractors, suppliers, and others as

needed to perform any of the functions provided for in this

subsection.

- "(6) To receive any monies, land, or equipment donated, appropriated, or otherwise acquired by it for the purposes provided for in this subsection.
- "(7) To charge and provide for collection of user fees for its services. The fees established shall take into consideration the costs of operating the division.
 - "(8) To make and adopt all necessary rules, regulations, and plans for its own guidance and for the proper conduct of the duties imposed upon it.
 - "(9) To review and approve or disapprove all proposed construction, renovation, or improvement projects for constructability, durability, and maintainability and to ensure the efficient use and availability of funds.
 - "(11) To review and administer all design and construction contracts for all state-owned facilities as provided for in this subsection.
 - "(12) To submit to the Director of Finance the priorities and recommendations for the repair, renovation, capital improvement, and planning needs of state departments, boards, bureaus, commissions, agencies, and offices.
- "(13) To review and approve or disapprove all state bond expenditures approved for construction.

"(14) To review all emergency project declarations
and to aid in the timely execution of emergency projects.

- "(b) The Division of Construction Management shall be headed by and under the supervision, direction, and control of an officer who shall be designated director of construction management. He or she shall be appointed, subject to the provisions of the state Merit Law, by the Director of Finance, with the approval of the Governor. The compensation of such officer shall be fixed in accordance with the pay plan of the state Merit System.
 - "(c) Effective October 1, 2015, the Building
 Commission established in Section 41-9-140 is abolished. All
 powers, authority, and jurisdiction of the Building
 Commission, including, but not limited to, those authorities
 currently established in Sections 16-1-2.1 and 16-1-2.2,
 16-16-10(o)(2) and (p), 34-14B-1 to 34-14B-10, 39-2-2(f)(1),
 41-9-160 to 41-9-165, 41-9-170 to 41-9-174, 41-9-243,
 41-9-542, 41-10-271, 41-10-364, and 41-16-72(3)(a) through (f)
 are hereby transferred to the Division of Construction
 Management within the Department of Finance.
 - "(d) (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article or any other provision of law to the contrary, the powers, authority, and jurisdiction granted to the Division of Construction Management within this section does not extend to property which is part of an educational institution or a state educational institution or any existing, planned, or future ancillary improvement on that property, including, but

not limited to, design or construction projects either partially or fully funded by the Public School and College Authority. The Division of Construction Management shall retain its authority to adopt uniform minimum building standards code for the construction and renovation of facilities at any educational institution or state educational institution. For purposes of this article and Sections 16-1-2.4 and 16-1-2.5, "educational institution" and "state educational institution" shall have the same meaning as provided in Section 16-17-1, but shall not include public K-12 schools or public four-year institutions of higher education with constitutionally created boards of trustees.

"(2) Except as otherwise provided in subdivision

(1), any powers, authority, and jurisdiction granted to the

Division of Construction Management within this section

relating to an educational institution or state educational

institution, including, but not limited to, those relating to

design or construction projects either partially or fully

funded by the Public School and College Authority, are hereby

transferred to the governing board of each institution, as

provided in Section 16-1-2.4.

"(e) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, all persons employed with the Building Commission on October 1, 2015, shall be transferred to the Department of Finance.

"(a) The Division of Construction Management within
the Department of Finance shall provide for the submission and
signing of documents via electronic means, at no additional
cost to the party submitting or signing the document.

- "(b) No later than November 30 of each year, the Division of Construction Management shall submit a report to the Speaker of the House, the Speaker Pro Tempore, the Lieutenant Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Majority Leader and Minority Leader of both the House of Representatives and the Senate. The report shall include all of the following, as they relate to each plan or project proposal submitted to the division during the preceding fiscal year relating to a public K-12 school:
- "(1) The name of the public K-12 school at which the project will take place.
 - "(2) The final cost of the project.
- "(3) Any increase in cost The number of state

 building code violations of a project as discovered by the

 field inspection of the construction improvements due to any

 requirement of or change to the plan or proposal requested by

 the division, and the reason for that increase itemized by

 categories, including, but not limited to, accessibility for

 disabled persons, fire safety, and life safety.
- "(4) For each document submitted to the division for review or approval, the time elapsed between the receipt of the document and the return of the document to the submitting party or other appropriate response by the division."

Section 2. The amendatory language of this act as it 1 2 amends Sections 16-1-2.4, 16-1-2.5, and 41-4-400, Code of 3 Alabama 1975, shall not apply to any construction, repair, maintenance, or renovation project at a K-12 school or a 4 public institution of higher education for which the physical 5 work has commenced prior to the effective date of this act. 6 Section 3. This act shall become effective 7 immediately following its passage and approval by the 8 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law. 9
