24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Section 2-2-5 of the Code of Alabama
26	1975, is amended to read as follows:
27	" \$2-2-5

"(a) The Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries shall be paid such salary as shall be fixed by law. Such The salary shall be payable from the Agricultural Fund of the State Treasury, and shall be payable to such the officer in installments in the same manner as the salaries of other state officers are paid. Such The salary shall be the entire annual compensation paid to the Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries for the performance of the duties of his the office and all ex officio duties of his the office.

"(b) Effective beginning the next term of office commencing in January 2023, the salary of the Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries shall be one hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000) per year. In addition, the commissioner shall be entitled to any cost-of-living pay increases and other benefits granted to state employees."

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
