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10 Relating to alcoholic beverages; to amend Section 2 of
11 Act 2022-431 of the 2022 Regular Session, now appearing as
12 Section 28-3A-13.3, Code of Alabama 1975, to revise the
13 amounts of alcoholic beverages that may be sold curbside.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

15 Section 1. Section 2 of Act 2022-431 of the 2022
16 Regular Session, now appearing as Section 28-3A-13.3, Code of
17 Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

18 "§28-3A-13.3

19 (a) A licensee of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board
20 who holds a license that allows the sale of alcoholic
21 beverages for on-premises consumption or for off-premises
22 consumption, or both, may sell alcoholic beverages, for
23 off-premises consumption only, using curbside pick-up or
24 takeout services.

25 (b) All alcoholic beverages sold pursuant to this
26 section must be in sealed, unopened containers and as follows:

27 (1) Liquor may be sold in any size ~~bottle~~ container,
28 provided the total amount of liquor sold may not exceed ~~one~~



29 liter~~9,000~~ milliliters per customer in any single 24-hour
30 period, except restaurant licensees' liquor sales may not
31 exceed 375 milliliters per customer and must be accompanied by
32 a food order.

33 (2) Table wine may be sold in any size ~~bottle~~
34 container, provided the total amount of table wine sold may
35 not exceed ~~1500~~9,000 milliliters or the equivalent of 12 750
36 milliliter bottles of table wine per customer.

37 (3) Beer, with the exception of draft beer, may be sold
38 in any packaging and in any size container, provided the total
39 amount of beer sold may not exceed ~~288~~ounces 120 12-ounce
40 containers of beer per customer.

41 (4) Draft beer may be sold only in areas where draft
42 sales are authorized and sealing requirements are met,
43 provided the total amount of draft beer sold may not exceed
44 288 ounces per customer.

45 (c) Any employee handling alcoholic beverages for a
46 pick-up or takeout order must be 21 years of age or older and
47 must verify that the recipient is 21 years of age or older.

48 (d) The licensee is responsible for complying with all
49 other laws of this title and rules adopted by the board
50 thereunder."

51 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
52 day of the third month following its passage and approval by
53 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
