8 Building's Goat Hill Museum Gift Shop, the Archives and  
9 History Gift Shop, the Governor's Mansion Gift Shop, the  
10 Montgomery Chamber of Commerce Welcome Center Gift Shop, along  
11 with numerous other locations and in every public library in  
12 the City of Montgomery; now therefore,
