8 CREATING THE SECONDARY METALS RECYCLING INDUSTRY
9 JOINT INTERIM LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE.

11 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
12 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Secondary Metals Recycling
13 Industry Joint Interim Legislative Committee is created. The
14 committee shall be composed of two members of the House of
15 Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House
16 of Representatives, one member of the Senate, to be appointed
17 by the Lieutenant Governor, an additional two members to be
18 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and
19 an additional two members to be appointed by the Lieutenant
20 Governor. The membership of the committee shall be inclusive
21 and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban and rural,
22 and economic diversity of the state. The chair and vice chair
23 of the committee shall be elected at the first meeting by the
24 members of the committee. The committee shall study all facets
25 of the secondary metals recycling industry, including
26 reviewing all proposed or to be proposed legislation.

1 Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the
2 Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall
3 provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the
4 committee. The committee shall report its findings,
5 conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature not later
6 than the fifth legislative day of the 2011 Regular Session,
7 whereupon the committee shall stand dissolved and discharged
8 of any further duties and liabilities. Each member of the
9 committee shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative
10 compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for
11 each day he or she attends a meeting of the committee. Upon
12 requisitions signed by the chair of the committee, these
13 payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the
14 use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn by the
15 Comptroller on the State Treasury. Notwithstanding the
16 foregoing, no member shall receive additional legislative
17 compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session or
18 if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates
19 for attendance on other state business. The total expenditures
20 of the committee shall not exceed \$5,000.
