4 CREATING THE SECONDARY METALS RECYCLING INDUSTRY
5 INTERIM STUDY COMMISSION.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
8 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Secondary Metals Recycling
9 Industry Interim Study Commission is created. The commission
10 shall be composed of two members of the House of
11 Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House
12 of Representatives, one member of the Senate, to be appointed
13 by the Lieutenant Governor, an additional two members to be
14 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and
15 an additional two members to be appointed by the Lieutenant
16 Governor. The membership of the commission shall be inclusive
17 and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban and rural,
18 and economic diversity of the state. The chair and vice chair
19 of the commission shall be elected at the first meeting by the
20 members of the commission. The commission shall study all
21 facets of the secondary metals recycling industry, including
22 reviewing all proposed or to be proposed legislation.

23 Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the
24 Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall
25 provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the
26 commission. The commission shall report its findings,

1 conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature not later
2 than the fifth legislative day of the 2011 Regular Session,
3 whereupon the commission shall stand dissolved and discharged
4 of any further duties and liabilities. Each member of the
5 commission shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative
6 compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for
7 each day he or she attends a meeting of the commission. Upon
8 requisitions signed by the chair of the commission, these
9 payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the
10 use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn by the
11 Comptroller on the State Treasury. Notwithstanding the
12 foregoing, no member shall receive additional legislative
13 compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session or
14 if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates
15 for attendance on other state business. The total expenditures
16 of the commission shall not exceed \$5,000.
