11 WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow and dismay that
12 news is received of the untimely death of Mrs. Charlotte
13 Angelin Hall Rich of Hamilton, Alabama, on January 28, 2010,
14 at the age of 57 years; and

15 WHEREAS, born August 30, 1952, she was a beloved and
16 esteemed educator who had lived in Hamilton all her life;
17 after graduating from the University of North Alabama with a
18 teaching degree, she returned to her alma mater, Hamilton High
19 School, in 1974, and dedicated her life to the countless
20 students who were fortunate to come under her caring and
21 expert tutelage; while she was primarily an English teacher,
22 she played many roles at the school over the years including
23 12th grade sponsor, Fellowship of Christian Athletes advisor,
24 Cheerleader sponsor, National Honor Society advisor, and Relay
25 for Life chairperson, along with many additional
26 responsibilities; Mrs. Rich was a faithful member of the First
27 United Methodist Church of Hamilton; and

1 WHEREAS, her love for literature and language was
2 manifest, and she challenged her students on many levels; even
3 the students who professed to "hate" English left her class
4 with a greater appreciation and respect for the subject; and

5 WHEREAS, among the many awards and honors Mrs. Rich
6 received, she was named ABC 33/40 Golden Apple Teacher of the
7 Year, City of Hamilton Citizen of the Year, and Hamilton High
8 School Alumni of the Year; and

9 WHEREAS, she leaves to mourn her death her son,
10 Christopher Collin Rich; mother, Tommie Lou Hall; brother,
11 Randy (Beverly) Hall; sister, Sheila Hall (Barry) Peoples;
12 nieces, Randi Nicole Hall and Sarah Katelyn Hughes; nephew,
13 Jordan Chase Hall; and many friends, colleagues, and former
14 students; preceding her in death was her father, Travis "Buck"
15 Hall; and

16 WHEREAS, Mrs. Rich inspired and encouraged her
17 students to work hard, be prepared, and do their best; within
18 the classroom and through the example of her life, she
19 motivated all those she encountered to live each day fully and
20 never give up even when things seemed hopeless, and while her
21 presence will be greatly missed, her legacy will endure for
22 many generations; now therefore,

23 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
24 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the untimely death of Mrs.
