2 ENROLLED, House Joint Resolution,

3 COMMENDING COREY RILLING ON ATTAINING THE RANK OF
4 EAGLE SCOUT IN THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA.

6 WHEREAS, commendations and congratulations are
7 extended to Corey Rilling of Brewton, Alabama, on attaining
8 the rank of Eagle Scout, the highest rank in the Boy Scouts of
9 America; and

10 WHEREAS, the Eagle Scout Award, earned by only a
11 small percentage of Scouts, involves the completion of an
12 Eagle Project and represents many years of diligence in
13 pursuit of a worthy goal that brings honor to the Scout, his
14 family, and his troop; work begins at age 11 and must be
15 completed by the Scout's 18th Birthday, and Corey finished at
16 age 17; and

17 WHEREAS, Corey is a member of Troop 42 of Brewton,
18 sponsored by the First United Methodist Church of Brewton; he
19 has progressed successfully through the levels of Scouting,
20 fulfilling many leadership roles while also meeting the
21 demanding requirements for achieving the Eagle Scout Award;

23 WHEREAS, for his Eagle Project, Corey constructed
24 and mounted owl boxes at Burnt Corn Creek Park; and

1 WHEREAS, in addition to completing an Eagle Project,
2 an Eagle Scout must earn at least 21 Merit Badges as evidence
3 of mastery in various Scouting skills, and must strive to
4 conduct himself with honor, loyalty, courage, cheer, and
5 service, the five integral responsibilities of a Scout; and

6 WHEREAS, Corey is an outstanding student-athlete at
7 T. R. Miller High School, where he plays both varsity football
8 and varsity baseball; he also participates in extracurricular
9 activities and has contributed countless volunteer hours to
10 worthy causes, including working with Habitat for Humanity and
11 taking part in a Wheelchair Mission Trip to Costa Rica; his
12 proud parents are Randy and Anne Rilling of Brewton; and

13 WHEREAS, through the years, Corey has exhibited
14 those hard-won characteristics of trustworthiness,
15 self-discipline, and good citizenship, all components of the
16 Scouting program; with the guidance and support of his
17 Scouting leaders, he has earned the esteem of his community,
18 fellow Scouts, and all Alabamians; now therefore,

19 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
20 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That in recognition of his
21 outstanding achievement in attaining the prestigious rank of
22 Eagle Scout, Corey Rilling is highly commended, and this
23 resolution is offered in tribute to him along with best wishes
24 in all future endeavors.
