10 WHEREAS, it is a great pleasure to commend
11 Lieutenant Steve Searcy of the Montgomery Police Department,
12 Commander of the Domestic Violence Unit, and recently selected
13 Executive Director of One Place, the first Family Justice
14 Center in Alabama, for his many years of exemplary service to
15 the City of Montgomery and the State of Alabama; and

16 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Searcy began his work with the
17 Montgomery Police Department in 1975, desiring to serve and
18 protect the citizens of the City of Montgomery; his passion
19 for public service enabled him to establish one of the first
20 domestic violence response units in the State; and

21 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Searcy's leadership on the issue
22 of domestic violence led to his role as chair and co-chair of
23 the Montgomery County Domestic Violence Task Force, one of the
24 longest standing and most effective law enforcement task
25 forces in the state; and

26 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Searcy's dedication to ending
27 domestic violence and protecting victims led him to provide

1 law enforcement training to thousands of police officers
2 throughout Alabama over the past 10 years, enhancing their
3 knowledge of best practices and increasing the safety of
4 victims and accountability for domestic violence offenders;

6 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Searcy has been recognized
7 nationally as an expert on law enforcement response to
8 domestic violence, conducting police seminars across the
9 country and testifying before Congressional Committees on the
10 subject of effective police intervention in cases of family
11 violence; and

12 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Searcy's commitment to and
13 compassion for victims of domestic violence is evident in his
14 long service with the Montgomery Police Department and in his
15 decision to lead the creation and inauguration of the first
16 Family Justice Center in Alabama; now therefore,

17 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
18 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we heartily commend Lieutenant
19 Steve Searcy of the Montgomery Police Department for his more
20 than 30 years of service to the citizens of the City of
21 Montgomery, that we congratulate him on the occasion of his
22 retirement from the Montgomery Police Department, and that we
23 extend our sincere gratitude and warm good wishes for his
24 continued, pioneering service to domestic violence victims as
25 the first Executive Director of One Place.
