9 ALABAMA STATE SPELLING BEE.

11 WHEREAS, it is with great pride and pleasure that
12 commendations and congratulations are extended to 13-year-old
13 Allison Black on winning the Alabama State Spelling Bee in the
14 high-pressure final competition on March 6, 2010, at Oak
15 Mountain High School in Birmingham; and

16 WHEREAS, an outstanding student who is in the eighth
17 grade at Ider School in DeKalb County, Allison Black had been
18 first runner-up in the statewide competition last year and
19 returned to capture the championship in the tenth round of the
20 83rd annual competition, winning the right to represent
