8 RE-ESTABLISHING THE SECONDARY METALS RECYCLING
9 INDUSTRY STUDY COMMISSION.

11 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
12 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Secondary Metals Recycling
13 Industry Study Commission, originally created as the Secondary
14 Metals Recycling Industry Interim Study Commission pursuant to
15 Act 2010-637, is re-established for the purpose of continuing
16 on a non-interim basis the study begun by the interim
17 commission. The commission shall be composed of two members of
18 the House of Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker
19 of the House of Representatives, one member of the Senate, to
20 be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, an additional two
21 members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
22 Representatives, an additional two members to be appointed by
23 the Lieutenant Governor, one member representing the
24 Department of Revenue recommended by the commissioner of the
25 department and approved by the other members of the
26 commission, one member to be appointed by the Alabama
27 Automobile Dealers Association, and the Executive Director of

1 the Alabama Sheriff's Association. The membership of the
2 commission shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender,
3 geographic, urban and rural, and economic diversity of the
4 state. The chair and vice chair of the commission shall be
5 elected at the first meeting by the members of the commission.
6 The commission shall study all facets of the secondary metals
7 recycling industry.

8 Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the
9 Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall
10 provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the
11 commission. The commission shall report its findings,
12 conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature not later
13 than the fifth legislative day of the 2014 Regular Session,
14 and the commission shall stand dissolved and discharged of any
15 further duties and liabilities at the end of the 2014 Regular
16 Session of the Legislature. Each member of the commission
17 shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative
18 compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for
19 each day he or she attends a meeting of the commission. Upon
20 requisitions signed by the chair of the commission, these
21 payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the
22 use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn by the
23 Comptroller on the State Treasury. Notwithstanding the
24 foregoing, no member shall receive additional legislative
25 compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session or
26 if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates

1 for attendance on other state business. The total expenditures
2 of the commission shall not exceed \$5,000.
