8 DESIGNATING APRIL 28, 2011, AS GIRL SCOUT DAY IN  
9 ALABAMA.

11 WHEREAS, Girl Scout Troop 1912, named for the year  
12 that the Girl Scouts was founded, is a bipartisan delegation  
13 of women and men of the Alabama House of Representatives and  
14 the Alabama Senate established by the Girl Scouts of  
15 North-Central Alabama and the Girl Scouts of Southern Alabama  
16 to educate our great state's legislative body about issues  
17 affecting girls and young women; and

18 WHEREAS, for almost 100 years, Girl Scouts has been  
19 engaged in girls' lives and been a resource for and expert in  
20 their growth and development; and

21 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts can lend expertise to  
22 policymakers combating a host of related and overlooked issues  
23 that affect girls' healthy living, including, relational  
24 aggression and bullying, cyber-bullying, healthy media images,  
25 and eating disorders; and

26 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts is committed to promoting  
27 girls' physical, social, and emotional health; increasing

1           girls' involvement in science, technology, engineering and  
2           math (STEM); building girls' leadership skills; and increasing  
3           girls' financial literacy; and

4                   WHEREAS, through the Girl Scout Leadership  
5           Experience, girls 5-17 discover themselves and their values,  
6           connect with other girls, and take action to make the world a  
7           better place; now therefore,

8                   BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF  
9           THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That April 28, 2011, is hereby  
10           designated Girl Scouts Day In Alabama, and we recognize the  
11           commitment Girl Scouting has made to support the leadership  
12           development of Alabama girls.
