11 Frank Campbell of Galant, Alabama, on Friday, April 29, 2011,  
12 at the age of 86 years; and

13 WHEREAS, a lifelong resident of Gallant, he was born  
14 on March 4, 1925, to the late Lula Hooks Campbell and James  
15 Hale Campbell, and was married to the late Doris Norton  
16 Campbell for 58 years; and

17 WHEREAS, he attended Etowah High School, Altoona  
18 High School, and the University of Alabama, later serving in  
19 the United States Navy during World War II; and

20 WHEREAS, June 15, 1949, Mr. Campbell was appointed  
21 Postmaster of Gallant by Representative Albert Rains, and he  
22 also served as city clerk, city carrier, and rural letter  
23 carrier, retiring from the post office on April 12, 1988; and

24 WHEREAS, for over 30 years, he enjoyed delivering  
25 flowers for Attalla Florist and he served for 17 years as  
26 Political Action Committee Chairman for the Alabama Rural  
27 Letter Carriers Association; and

1                   WHEREAS, he was a member of Ivalee Baptist Church,  
2 serving as deacon, and was a Mason from 1948 until his death,  
3 receiving his 50-year Masonic pin; and

4                   WHEREAS, in addition to his wife and parents, he was  
5 preceded in death by his siblings, Willie Mac Campbell, Julius  
6 Campbell, Ray Campbell, Veraline Campbell Howard, and Hubert  
7 Campbell; and left to cherish his memory are his son, Benny  
8 Campbell; his daughter, June Campbell Styles (Brent); his  
9 granddaughter, Stacie Styles (W. Ken McCracken); his siblings,  
10 Grady, Ralph, Frances, and Louie Campbell and Bill Hooks; his  
11 sisters-in-law, Thelma Edgar, Carolyn Campbell, Juanita  
12 Campbell, Elaine Campbell, Pinky Hooks, and Faye Campbell; his  
13 brother-in-law, Raymond Howard; and numerous beloved nieces
