3 MOURNING THE DEATH OF UNITED STATES AIR FORCE MAJOR  
4 JEFFREY O. AUSBORN.

6 WHEREAS, with an overwhelming sense of loss, we  
7 receive news of the heroic death of United States Air Force  
8 Major Jeffrey O. Ausborn of Gadsden, Alabama, on April 27,  
9 2011, at the age of 41 years; and

10 WHEREAS, he was killed in the line of duty while  
11 serving in Afghanistan as a member of the valiant 438th Air  
12 Expeditionary Wing, where he served as a C-27 instructor pilot  
13 with the 99th Flying Training Squadron; and

14 WHEREAS, a 19-year Air Force veteran, he had  
15 volunteered in 2010 to go to Afghanistan to teach new Afghan  
16 pilots how to fly the C-27 aircraft; in addition to his  
17 expertise, he was highly regarded as a communicator,  
18 instructor, and supervisor who will be remembered for his  
19 compassion and patience; and

20 WHEREAS, he is survived by his beloved wife, Suzanna  
21 Ausborn, and five children, Emily, Eric, Shelby, Mitchell  
22 Maloy, and Summer Maloy; and

23 WHEREAS, Major Ausborn personified the noblest  
24 qualities of America's Armed Forces who serve far from home in  
25 defense of freedom and democracy, enduring immeasurable

1       hardships and risking their lives for their fellowman;  
2       although his presence will be missed, his legacy will endure  
3       and his memory will be cherished in the hearts and minds of  
4       those who were fortunate to know him during the brief span of  
5       his lifetime; now therefore,

6                   BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH  
7       HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the heroic death of United  
8       States Air Force Major Jeffrey O. Ausborn is recorded with  
9       reverence and sorrow, and this resolution is offered in  
10      highest tribute to his life, along with heartfelt sympathy to  
11      his grieving family.
