8 MOURNING THE DEATH OF LOYD PINKNEY ESTES.

11 received of the death of Loyd Pinkney Estes of Gadsden, who
12 died on March 13, 2011, at the age of 85 years; and

14 Carolina, on October 3, 1925, to parents Napoleon Bonaparte

24 parents; and his loving wife, Betty Wells Estes; and

25 WHEREAS, memories of Mr. Estes will live on with his
26 daughters, Sherry Black and Marsha Johnson; brother, Russell
