8 MOURNING THE DEATH OF JOHN DAVIS RICHIE.

10 WHEREAS, with profound sorrow and regret, we receive
11 news of the death of John Davis Richie, of Glencoe, who passed
12 away on Monday, May 16, 2011, at the age of 80 years; and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Richie was born November 30, 1930, to
14 Howard and Nannie Richie of Ohatchee; he went to Duke School
15 and graduated from Alexandria High School in 1949; after high
16 school, John joined the U.S. Navy and traveled the world,
17 serving our country for 22 years; he would retire as a Senior
18 Chief in 1972 and would move his family back to Alabama, near
19 his birthplace; he returned to school and earned a Master's
20 degree in Business from Jacksonville State University in 1977
21 and retired from the Alabama Department of Revenue; he was
22 also a published poet and author of several theological books;

24 WHEREAS, a passionate Gideon for many years, he
25 often taught Sunday School and was a very active member of his
26 local Baptist Church; he was a deacon at Bonny Brook Baptist

1 Church in Jacksonville and was a member of the First Baptist
2 Church of Glencoe; and

3 WHEREAS, Mr. Richie is survived by his wife, Sue
4 Richie; children, Tina Ford, Terry Richie, and Tony Richie;
5 sister, Margaret Taylor; and five grandchildren; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Richie was dedicated to the Lord and
7 his family; he will be truly missed by all who were fortunate
8 to know him during his lifetime; now therefore,

9 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
