8 CLARIFYING LANGUAGE IN THE GOVERNOR'S PROPOSAL FOR
9 CREATING JOBS.

11 WHEREAS, the language in Governor Bentley's "Jobs
12 Bills" can be confusing to some; this resolution is basically
13 identical, only with more clear, straightforward language; and

17 maintenance workers; and

4 portion of the Education Trust Fund is actually meant to be
5 Governor Bentley's 2.9 billion dollar piggy bank; and

6 WHEREAS, Republicans correctly believe that public
7 education is a form of welfare that teaches children that they
8 are entitled to receive something for nothing, thus making
9 corporations to be better recipients for this government
10 funded bailout; and

11 WHEREAS, the free market works, so a taxpayer funded
12 corporate welfare program would only make it work better; and

13 WHEREAS, working Alabamians are usually overpaid and
14 in support of donating their easily earned money to their
15 bosses; now therefore,

16 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
17 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the State of Alabama takes

20 "jobs."
