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2 ENROLLED, House Joint Resolution,

3 CREATING THE CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE TASK FORCE.

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5 WHEREAS, chronic kidney disease is a growing health
6 problem in the United States; a recent report by the Centers
7 for Disease Control determined that 16.8 percent of all adults
8 above the age of 20 years have chronic kidney disease; and

9 WHEREAS, one in six individuals have kidney disease,
10 with over 400,000 patients on dialysis or receiving kidney
11 transplants, and 67,000 people die each year because of kidney
12 failure; and

13 WHEREAS, chronic kidney disease is more prevalent
14 among individuals above 60 years of age, and among Hispanic,
15 African-American, Asian or Pacific Islander, and Native
16 American people; and

17 WHEREAS, the National Kidney Foundation of Alabama,
18 the Alabama Kidney Foundation, and the American Kidney Fund
19 encourage efforts to educate Americans, particularly those in
20 high-risk communities, about chronic kidney disease (CKD) and
21 to provide strategies for preventing or slowing the
22 progression of the disease; and

23 WHEREAS, appropriate government agencies as well as
24 private entities would be able to allocate resources to

1 reducing the human toll and economic burden of chronic kidney
2 disease; now therefore,

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
4 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Chronic Kidney Disease
5 Task Force is hereby created. The task force shall consist of
6 the following members:

7 (1) Two members of the Alabama Senate appointed by
8 the Lieutenant Governor.

9 (2) Two members of the Alabama House of
10 Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House.

11 (3) The State Health Officer, or his or her
12 designee.

13 (4) Two practicing nephrologists appointed by the
14 Lieutenant Governor.

15 (5) Two practicing nephrologists appointed by the
16 Speaker of the House of Representatives.

17 (6) Two members appointed by the Alabama Kidney
18 Foundation.

19 (7) The Director of the Alabama Department of Senior
20 Services or his or her designee.

21 (8) The Commissioner of the Alabama Department of
22 Human Resources or his or her designee.

23 (9) Two members who are representatives of
24 nephrology patient advocacy groups selected by the Governor.

(10) Three members appointed by the Alabama Council of Nephrology Social Workers.

(11) Two members appointed by the American
Nephrology Nurses Association.

Members shall serve without compensation. The membership of the task force shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state. The sponsor of this resolution shall call the first meeting of the task force at which the members shall elect a chair and vice-chair.

The task force shall assess the current and future impact of Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) on residents of Alabama, shall examine the existing industries, services, and resources addressing the needs of persons with CKD and their families and caregivers, and shall develop a strategy to help mobilize a state response to the CKD.

The task force shall include an examination of the following in its assessment and recommendations:

(1) Trends in state CKD population and needs, including the changing population with CKD and other complications associated with getting treatment for CKD including, but not limited to, Medicaid eligibility and transportation needs for CKD patients.

(2) The state role in long-term care, family caregiver support, and assistance to persons with CKD and its complications.

(3) State policy regarding the effective treatment and prevention of CKD.

The task force shall hold public meetings and utilize technological means, such as web casts, to gather feedback on the recommendations from the general public and from persons and families affected by CKD.

The CKD Task Force shall regularly update the members of Alabama's Congressional Delegation and shall solicit their participation in addressing the significant health care and transportation needs of Alabama citizens with Chronic Kidney Disease.

The chair of the task force shall create and appoint members to not more than three advisory sub-task forces, which shall include members of the task force, representatives from governmental agencies, and members of the public with interest and expertise in the objectives of the task force. Each advisory sub-task force shall be cochaired by a member of the task force and a non-legislative task force member elected by the members of the sub-task force.

The task force shall submit its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature in the form of a State CKD Plan no later than the end of the

1 quadrennium in which the task force was created at which time
2 the task force shall stand dissolved.

3 Each legislative member of the task force and each
4 legislative member of any advisory sub-task force shall be
5 entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his
6 or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she
7 attends a meeting of the task force or a sub-task force, which
8 shall be paid out of any funds appropriated for the use of the
9 Legislature, upon warrants drawn by the state Comptroller,
10 upon requisitions signed by the task force chair; provided,
11 however, legislative members shall not receive additional
12 legislative compensation or per diem for a regular or special
13 session meeting day or committee meeting day of any special or
14 regular session, or if a member is being paid any other
15 payments on the same dates for attendance on other state
16 business. Non-legislative members of the task force and
17 advisory sub-task forces may be reimbursed for meetings
18 according to the policies and procedures of the respective
19 agencies and groups represented.

20 The annual expenses of the task force shall not
21 exceed \$1.000.
