8 MOURNING THE DEATH OF MRS. ELSIE BURROUGHS DAVIS.

10 WHEREAS, with an overwhelming sense of loss, we  
11 receive news of the death of Mrs. Elsie Burroughs Davis on  
12 April 6, 2012, at the age of 89 years; and

13 WHEREAS, born on September 27, 1922, in Whatley,  
14 Alabama, she was the 12th and youngest child born to Robert  
15 "Bob" and Mamie Burroughs; she became a devout Christian at an  
16 early age and later united with the Mt. Olive Missionary  
17 Baptist Church No. 1; soon after marrying Joe Walter Davis in  
18 1939, she moved to Mobile, Alabama, to begin her life as a  
19 devoted wife and mother; she will be remembered for her  
20 feistiness and high spirit, but more so for her love of  
21 family; and

22 WHEREAS, Mrs. Davis lived a disciplined and  
23 purpose-filled life; she loved to work with her hands and  
24 enjoyed planting in her flower beds and vegetable garden;  
25 rarely one to be still, she often rose before the sun and  
26 spent many nights preparing for the day to come; she was wise  
27 beyond education and lived a life that was an amazing example

1 of integrity and persistence; while unable to obtain formal  
2 schooling herself, she emphasized to all her children the  
3 significance of education; she also conveyed to her children  
4 the power of the Golden Rule; she was a strict disciplinarian  
5 who accepted from herself and her children nothing less than  
6 to strive for excellence; and

7 WHEREAS, in addition to her parents and her husband,  
8 she was predeceased by her son, Willie Herman Davis; four  
9 brothers; and seven sisters; and

10 WHEREAS, survivors include eight children, Joe  
11 (Phyllis) Davis, Geneva Davis (Bobby) White, Linda Davis  
12 (Jimmy) Graham, Frank (Maxime) Davis, LaVerne (David)
