8 MOURNING THE DEATH OF MRS. SANDRA ANNE STARR MOON.

10 WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we mourn  
11 the death of Mrs. Sandra Anne Starr Moon of Huntsville,  
12 Alabama, on April 9, 2013, at the age of 66 years; and

13 WHEREAS, her passing leaves a void in the lives of  
14 her loving family and her many friends; she served three terms  
15 on the Huntsville City Council and became the first female to  
16 be president of the council; before entering the political  
17 arena, she worked as executive director of the AIDS Action  
18 Coalition and the Huntsville Mental Health Association; and

19 WHEREAS, born on May 29, 1946, in Washington, D.C.,  
20 she was the daughter of the late Marie Flynn Starr and William  
21 F. Starr; she was a 1968 graduate of Lindenwood College with a  
22 Bachelor's Degree in English and went on to earn a Master's  
23 Degree in Library Science from the University of Maryland in  
24 1981; and

25 WHEREAS, among her significant contributions to  
26 mankind, she worked as American Red Cross Services Director to  
27 the Military in the Far East; after living around the world as

1 the wife of a United States Army officer, she moved to her  
2 husband's hometown, Huntsville, in 1993; she was first elected  
3 to the City Council in 1998 and was reelected in 2002 and  
4 2006; and

5 WHEREAS, survivors include her devoted husband of  
6 almost 45 years, John Moon; sons, King S. (Christie) Moon and  
7 Lieutenant Colonel Joshua L. (Christine) Moon; daughter, Kelly  
8 M. (Adam) Crutchfield; brother, William F. Starr, Jr.; and  
9 nine grandchildren, Holden, Taylor, Conner, Jackson, Preston,  
10 Vivienne, Olivia, Kellan, and Aidan; and

11 WHEREAS, Mrs. Moon was a valued member of the  
12 community; although her presence will be greatly missed, her  
13 legacy of service will endure and her memory will be cherished  
14 in the hearts of those who were fortunate to know her; now  
15 therefore,

16 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF  
17 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the death of Mrs. Sandra Anne  
18 Starr Moon is recorded with deep sadness, and this resolution
