11 the death of Reverend William Earl "Lil Buddy" Hill on April
12 12, 2013, at the age of 73 years; and

16 Alabama, he was the son of Thomas Hill and the late Edna Mae
17 Hill; he accepted Christ at an early age, uniting with the
18 Good Hope Missionary Baptist Church, and later joined the

22 System, he did further study at Selma University and earned a

4 janitor at Vanity Fair Central Cutting in Monroeville,
5 retiring in 2005; he enjoyed fishing, gardening, sports of all

8 and devoted wife, Lois Jean Hill; his father, two sons,
9 William E. (Cheryl) Hill, Jr., and Donnell (Darlene) Hill;
10 three daughters, Edna Kirkland, Jennifer Hill, and Erica
11 (Aaron Jr.) Lee; ten grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren;
12 brothers, Frazier (Willie Kate) Hill, Thomas Jr. (Janice)
13 Hill, Archie (Cassie) Hill, Curtis (Linda) Hill, John
14 (Shirley) Hill, and Kelvin (Georgia) Hill; sisters, Brenda
