8 CREATING THE ALABAMA DUI PREVENTION AND IGNITION
9 INTERLOCK ADVISORY COUNCIL

11 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
12 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is hereby created the
13 Alabama DUI Prevention and Ignition Interlock Advisory
14 Council. The primary purpose of the advisory council shall be
15 to identify successful methods and strategies to reduce the
16 number of individuals driving under the influence and, in
17 turn, alcohol-related fatalities in this state. To accomplish
18 this purpose, the advisory council shall conduct an in-depth
19 analysis of pertinent laws, rules, and regulations in this
20 state relating to driving under the influence and ignition
21 interlocks and provide suggested modifications to enhance
22 these laws, rules, and regulations.

23 The members of the advisory council shall include
24 the following: A member of the House of Representatives
25 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; a
26 member of the House of Representatives with a law enforcement
27 background appointed by the Speaker Pro Tempore of the House

1 of Representatives; a member of the Senate appointed by the
2 Senate President Pro Tempore; a member of the Senate with a
3 legal background appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; a
4 member appointed by the Governor; the Chair of the House
5 Public Safety and Homeland Security Committee, or his or her
6 designee from the committee; the Chairman of the Senate
7 Judiciary Committee, or his or her designee from the
8 committee; the Director of the Administrative Office of
9 Courts, or his or her designee; the Director of the Department
10 of Public Safety or his or her designee; the Chief of the
11 Department of Public Safety Drivers License Division, or his
12 or her designee; the Director of the Department of Forensic
13 Sciences, or his or her designee; the Office of Prosecution
14 Services Traffic Safety Resource Prosecutor, or his or her
15 designee; the President of the Alabama Circuit Judges
16 Association, or his or her designee; the Commissioner of the
17 Department of Mental Health, or his or her designee; a member
18 appointed by the Court Referral Officer Association of
19 Alabama; a member appointed by Mothers Against Drunk Driving
20 Alabama; the Chief of the Law Enforcement and Traffic Division
21 of ADECA, or his or her designee; a member appointed by the
22 Alabama Criminal Defense Lawyers Association; the President of
23 the Alabama Association of Chiefs of Police, or his or her
24 designee; the President of the Alabama Sheriffs' Association,
25 or his or her designee; and a member appointed from each
26 approved ignition interlock provider according to the
27 Department of Forensic Sciences. The membership of the

1 advisory council shall be inclusive and reflect the racial,
2 gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the
3 state.

4 The first meeting of the advisory council shall be
5 held within 180 days of the effective date of this act. The
6 advisory council shall elect a chair from its membership at
7 its first meeting and shall hold, at a minimum, one annual
8 meeting. The chair shall schedule additional meetings as he or
9 she deems necessary. The council may hold public meetings as
10 necessary for the purpose of receiving input from the public
11 relating to the effectiveness of current driving under the
12 influence and ignition interlock laws, rules, and regulations.

13 All meetings of the advisory council shall be open
14 to the public. All findings, conclusions, and recommendations
15 for improvement of current driving under the influence laws,
16 rules, and regulations, if any, of the advisory council shall
17 be reported to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the
18 Speaker of the House of Representatives. The report shall also
19 be made available to the public.
