16 community, where she was highly regarded; and

17 WHEREAS, upon graduating from Central High School in
18 1959, she attended Florida A&M University and Spalding
19 Business College; and

20 WHEREAS, her multiple civic and professional
21 contributions include working with the Mobile County
22 Coordinating Committee for Registering and Voting, serving as
23 a vote specialist for NAACP, helping reorganize the Mobile,
24 Prichard, Mt. Vernon, Jackson and Chatom, Alabama, branches of
25 the NAACP, serving as Youth Director for the Mobile branch of
26 the NAACP, serving as head of the U.S. Senate Mobile office
27 and serving as a past member of the executive branch of the

1 Mobile NAACP; she was a member of the following organizations:
2 The League of Women Voters, the Mobile Chapter of Florida A&M
3 Alumni Association, Charter Member of the Alabama Democratic
4 Conference, the Democratic Women's Club of South Alabama, the
5 National Federation of Democratic Women, the National Council
6 of Negro Women and the United States Senate Staff Club; and

7 WHEREAS, she was selected as Zeta Phi Beta's Women
8 of the Year in 1976; and

9 WHEREAS, her meritorious actions and magnanimous
10 efforts glorified God; she was a loving mother whose
11 incomparable dedication to her sons was magnified over the
12 years as she selflessly gave of her talents, energies and time
13 to support kingdom building in her family, church and the
14 community; and

16 (Johanne) Carroll, Jr., and Christopher L. (Denise) Carroll;
