7 June 5, 2013, with deep sadness; we commend her immeasurable
8 life of 72 years with great thanksgiving; and

9 WHEREAS, the passing of Mrs. Carroll leaves a void
10 in the lives of her loving family, many friends and the entire
11 community, where she was highly regarded; and

12 WHEREAS, upon graduating from Central High School in
13 1959, she attended Florida A&M University and Spalding
14 Business College; and

15 WHEREAS, her multiple civic and professional
16 contributions include working with the Mobile County
17 Coordinating Committee for Registering and Voting, serving as
18 a vote specialist for NAACP, helping reorganize the Mobile,
19 Prichard, Mt. Vernon, Jackson and Chatom, Alabama, branches of
20 the NAACP, serving as Youth Director for the Mobile branch of
21 the NAACP, serving as head of the U.S. Senate Mobile office
22 and serving as a past member of the executive branch of the
23 Mobile NAACP; she was a member of the following organizations:
24 The League of Women Voters, the Mobile Chapter of Florida A&M
25 Alumni Association, Charter Member of the Alabama Democratic

1 Conference, the Democratic Women's Club of South Alabama, the
2 National Federation of Democratic Women, the National Council
3 of Negro Women and the United States Senate Staff Club; and

4 WHEREAS, she was selected as Zeta Phi Beta's Women
5 of the Year in 1976; and

6 WHEREAS, her meritorious actions and magnanimous
7 efforts glorified God; she was a loving mother whose
8 incomparable dedication to her sons was magnified over the
9 years as she selflessly gave of her talents, energies and time
10 to support kingdom building in her family, church and the
11 community; and

12 WHEREAS, survivors include two sons, William C.
13 (Johanne) Carroll, Jr., and Christopher L. (Denise) Carroll;
14 four grandchildren, William C. Carroll, III, Julia K. Carroll,
15 Morgan C. Carroll and Xavier Taylor-Carroll; sister, Rebecca
16 Hayes Charles; brother, Samuel Hayes; nieces and nephews,
17 Karen Charles, Terry Charles, Darrell Charles and Angela
