9 VOLUNTEERS WHO COORDINATED THE SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTION'S
10 TRAVELING EXHIBIT, "THE WAY WE WORKED," IN RED BAY, ALABAMA.

12 WHEREAS, highest commendations and congratulations
13 are herein proudly presented to Rosalyn Fabianke and all of
14 the volunteers who diligently coordinated the Smithsonian
15 Institution's traveling exhibit from Washington, D.C., and the
16 inaugural Alabama tour for the Smithsonian Institution's
17 Museum on Main Street (MoMS), "The Way We Worked," in Red Bay,
18 Alabama; and

19 WHEREAS, Red Bay has the worthy distinction of being
20 one of six cities, and the inaugural host town, in the State
21 of Alabama to be selected as a destination point for this
22 prestigious exhibit from Washington, D.C.; and
