3 DESIGNATING THE PORTION OF INTERSTATE 59 NORTH
4 BETWEEN MILE MARKERS 130 AND 131 AS THE OFFICER JOHN MARTIN
5 HUFFMAN MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

7 WHEREAS, Officer John Martin Huffman of the City of
8 Birmingham Police Department was struck and killed on I-59 by
9 a car operated by a driver who was under the influence of
10 narcotics on May 21, 1992; and

11 WHEREAS, Officer Huffman had been with the
12 Birmingham Police Department for 12 years at the time of his
13 death; and

14 WHEREAS, he was survived by his expectant wife and,
15 in December 1992, his son was born and named for him; and

16 WHEREAS, the bravery, devotion to duty, and love of
17 community of this fallen hero have forever earned him a place
18 in the hearts and memories of the citizens he willingly risked
19 his life to protect, an honor that comes at enormous cost to
20 the people who knew him best, loved him most, and remember him
21 as husband, father, relative, and friend; and

22 WHEREAS, it is altogether fitting and proper that we
23 remember and honor Officer Huffman; now therefore,

24 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
25 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the portion of Interstate

1 Highway 59 North between mile markers 130 and 131 be
2 designated as the Officer John Martin Huffman Memorial Highway
3 in honor of his service and sacrifice to our state and the
4 City of Birmingham.

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the appropriate
6 officials are requested to place and maintain signs or markers
7 as provided in this resolution.
