8 MOURNING THE DEATH OF MR. HORACE NUNLEY STRONG, III.

10 WHEREAS, we deeply regret and are greatly saddened
11 to learn of the death of Mr. Horace Nunley Strong, III, on
12 August 22, 2015; his invaluable life of 75 years is commended
13 and celebrated with tremendous thanksgiving; and

14 WHEREAS, the passing of Mr. Strong leaves a void in
15 the lives of his loving family, many friends, and the entire
16 community, where he was highly regarded; and

17 WHEREAS, Mr. Strong was born August 28, 1939, to the
18 union of Horace Nunley Strong, Jr., and Louise McCrary Strong;
19 he graduated from Monrovia High School in 1957; and

20 WHEREAS, Mr. Strong operated Strong's Shop Ezy in
21 the Monrovia Community for 35 years and Strong Tours from 1992
22 until his death; he was a veteran of the Alabama National
23 Guard; and

24 WHEREAS, notably, he served as a founding member and
25 Chief of the Monrovia Volunteer Fire Department for 23 years;
26 he drove a school bus for the Madison County School System for

1 many years; in addition, he was a charter member of the
2 Monrovia Men's Club and the Monrovia Parks and Recreation
3 Association and was a Monrovia School Trustee for 25 years;

5 WHEREAS, Mr. Strong was a faithful and dedicated
6 member of Mount Zion Baptist Church in Monrovia, which he
7 attended all of his life; and

8 WHEREAS, survivors include his beloved and devoted
9 wife of 21 years, Judy Giles Strong; children, Kelly Strong
10 (Carlton) Brewer, Horace "Nunley" (Janet) Strong IV, Dale
11 Whitney (Laura) Strong, Kim Giles (Eric) Guerin, Donald Clay
12 (Suzanne) Giles, and Kelly Giles (Scott) Guthrie; sister,
13 Myrna Strong Ford; grandchildren, Meredith Brewer, John
14 Brewer, Cara Strong, Quinn Strong, Whitney Strong, Harrison
15 Strong, Matt Guerin, Courtney Guerin (Wes) Brown, Jacob
16 Guerin, Kirsten Giles, Callie Giles, Nathan Giles, Rachel
