6 Electrical Engineering Department, before furthering her
7 education at Massey Draughn Business College, where she
8 studied Business Math; later in life, she owned a lucrative
9 florist shop in her hometown; she was a faithful member of Red
10 Bay Free Will Baptist Church; and

11 WHEREAS, Mrs. Hamm painstakingly researched her
12 family history and left her loved ones with hundreds of
13 invaluable genealogy documents; she tackled life head first
14 and always found a solution to any problem; she freely spoke
15 her mind and encouraged all women to do the same; and

16 WHEREAS, survivors include her beloved and devoted
17 husband, Tilmon Hamm; two children, Lisa M. Jackson (Mike) and
18 Bill Morrow (Jamie); two stepchildren, Cindy Prestage and
