7 death of Mrs. Wanda Grissom Hamm of Red Bay, Alabama, on March
8 11, 2017, at 75 years of age, and we uplift her inspiring life
9 and legacy with utmost reverence and respect; and

10 WHEREAS, the passing of Mrs. Hamm leaves a void in
11 the lives of her loving family, many friends, and the entire
12 community, where she was highly regarded; and

13 WHEREAS, a gifted woman, Mrs. Hamm was an artist,
14 writer, and florist; she passionately cultivated her elegant
15 yard filled with magnificent flowers and trees; Mrs. Hamm
16 loved her family fiercely and never missed any of her
17 children's school functions or events; she was the selfless
18 type who would gladly do without so her children,
19 grandchildren, nieces and nephews could have everything their
20 hearts desired; she was affectionately known as Nana not only
21 to her grandchildren, but also to their friends; and

22 WHEREAS, Mrs. Hamm was born in Itawamba County,
23 Mississippi, to the union of Heyburn and Jewell Williams
24 Grissom; during high school, she was a majorette, and upon
25 graduating, she attended Northeast Mississippi Junior College;

1 she entered employment with the Mississippi State University
2 Electrical Engineering Department, before furthering her
3 education at Massey Draughn Business College, where she
4 studied Business Math; later in life, she owned a lucrative
5 florist shop in her hometown; she was a faithful member of Red
6 Bay Free Will Baptist Church; and

7 WHEREAS, Mrs. Hamm painstakingly researched her
8 family history and left her loved ones with hundreds of
9 invaluable genealogy documents; she tackled life head first
10 and always found a solution to any problem; she freely spoke
11 her mind and encouraged all women to do the same; and

12 WHEREAS, survivors include her beloved and devoted
13 husband, Tilmon Hamm; two children, Lisa M. Jackson (Mike) and
14 Bill Morrow (Jamie); two stepchildren, Cindy Prestage and
15 Marsha Bloom; nine grandchildren; four great-grandchildren;
16 one sister, Nedra Daws; and a host of nieces and nephews; she
17 was preceded in death by her parents and two sisters, Doris
18 Jean Grissom and Sue Harris; and

19 WHEREAS, Mrs. Hamm was a valued member of the
20 community; although her presence is greatly missed, her memory
21 is cherished in the hearts and minds of all those who were
22 fortunate enough to know her; now therefore,
