3 A PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING ALS AWARENESS MONTH.  
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5 WHEREAS, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), better  
6 known as Lou Gehrig's disease, is a fatal disease  
7 characterized by progressive degeneration of motor neurons in  
8 the brain and spinal cord leading to a loss of voluntary  
9 muscle control; and

10 WHEREAS, ALS has no known cause, means of  
11 prevention, or cure; and

12 WHEREAS, nearly 6,000 Americans are diagnosed with  
13 ALS every year, and an estimated 35,000 Americans are  
14 afflicted with the disease; and

15 WHEREAS, military veterans are at a greatly  
16 increased risk of developing ALS compared to those who have  
17 never served in the military; and

18 WHEREAS, ALS eventually causes muscular atrophy and  
19 the patient becomes a dysfunctional quadriplegic requiring  
20 total and constant care; and

21 WHEREAS, the progression of ALS causes the patient  
22 to experience difficulty in swallowing, talking, and  
23 breathing; and

24 WHEREAS, on average, patients diagnosed with ALS  
25 only survive two to five years from the time of diagnosis; and

1           WHEREAS, the advanced stages of ALS can be  
2     financially crippling, depleting the resources of patients and  
3     families; and

4           WHEREAS, a national ALS patient registry,  
5     administered by the Center for Disease Control, is currently  
6     identifying cases of ALS in the United States through  
7     voluntary reporting; and

8           WHEREAS, the ALS Association, many individuals and  
9     organizations across Alabama and the United States are  
10    aggressively searching for treatments and a cure for ALS  
11    through active research and clinical programs; and

12          WHEREAS, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Awareness  
13    Month increases the public awareness of ALS patients'  
14    circumstances and acknowledges the devastating impact this  
15    disease has on the patient, his or her family and the  
16    community as a whole, and recognizes the research being done  
17    to eradicate this terrible disease; now therefore,

18          BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH  
19    HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we recognize May 2019, as  
20    Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) Month in Alabama, and this  
21    resolution is offered in highest tribute along with best  
22    wishes for success in the noble quest for a cure for Lou  
23    Gehrig's Disease.
