HONORING AND COMMENDING RONALD M. COFIELD FOR HIS  
WORK WITH THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON THE TAX CUTS AND  
JOBS ACT AND THE ALABAMA BUSINESS TAX COMPETITIVENESS ACT.

WHEREAS, on February 12, 2021, Governor Kay Ivey  
signed Act 2021-1, legislation that exempted federal COVID-19  
relief funds from state income taxation, amended how business  
income is calculated in Alabama, and decoupled Alabama tax law  
from certain provisions of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act; and

WHEREAS, the passage of this legislation could not  
have occurred without the participation of the Joint  
Legislative Task Force on the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act, which  
worked over an 18-month period to discuss policy, consider  
short- and long-term effects, and craft legislation; and

WHEREAS, among the leaders of that charge was Ronald  
M. Cofield; from inception to the drafting of legislation, Ron  
freely offered his knowledge and experience for the benefit of  
the task force and, thus, the entire state; and

WHEREAS, the knowledge and experience that Ron  
brought include a 38-year career with PricewaterhouseCoopers,

1 where he served as an audit partner as well as the managing  
2 partner of the Orlando office, the Birmingham office, and the  
3 Carolinas practice, Market Assurance Leader for the Greater  
4 Atlanta practice, and the United States Assurance Learning and  
5 Development Leader; Ron's resume also includes lengthy  
6 community leadership service, including service as director of  
7 the United Way, Operation New Birmingham, the Kiwanis Club of  
8 Birmingham, and the Alabama Ballet, as well as Vice-Chairman  
9 of the American Red Cross; Ron has also served on the Business  
10 School Advisory Councils of Auburn University, Samford  
11 University, and The University of Alabama at Birmingham; and

13 greater Alabama community deserves commendation beyond what is  
14 offered in this resolution; however, this body sees fit to  
15 honor him in the best manner available to us now; now
